This expectation may be met by a recent Ph.D., a record of recent scholarly publications, or professional experience of a suitable length and level of responsibility. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience based upon CSU pay scales. Ideal candidate will demonstrate ability to teach, advise, and mentor students from diverse backgrounds.
