Among others Rep. Grijalva is a member of the Congressional Border Caucus, LGBT Equality Caucus, Native American Caucus, co-chair of the Congressional Progressive Caucus and the Immigration Task Force (of the Congressional Progressive Caucus)

Rep. Grijalva is introducing an alternative immigration bill to the Pelosi-Becerra Bill. He will discuss comprehensive immigration reform that includes a pathway to legalization. Grijalva says that Congress cannot continue with a "one fence fits all" mentality. The congressman continues that approximately 2.8 million students graduate from U.S. high schools every year, and that some will go on to college, some will join the military and others will take different paths.
