## Entry-Level Public Health Consultant Officer - Seattle, WA

Position Description and Duties

The Department of the Interior (DOI)/National Park Service (NPS) is recruiting a Commissioned Corps officer to fill the position of Public Health Consultant with a duty station in Seattle, Washington.

Applicants in the EHO, HSO, and Engineering categories will be considered.

This position is responsible for assisting the National Park Service Park Superintendents in an assigned geographic area within the Pacific West Region. Applicants should have an environmental/public health background.

Responsibilities include evaluation of food safety, drinking water safety, wastewater treatment and disposal, zoonotic and vector borne disease and consultation for all public health related issues that may occur in the assigned parks. Other specific areas of public health responsibility and support include recreational water, special events, training, outbreak investigation, plan review, and emergency/disaster response for both the National Park Service and for the Public Health Service.

The position requires moderate travel, which is concentrated in the summer season (April through September). Two years of field experience in the performance of public health, environmental health, engineering, or related fields is required. A Bachelor of Science degree in environmental health, engineering, public health or a related field is required. In addition, applicants must meet OFRD Readiness Standards.

Civilian applicants must be willing and able to qualify for a commission in the Commissioned Corps of the United States Public Health Service.
