

U.S. CONSTITUTION REQUIREMENT

The requirement of competence in U.S. Constitution can be met in two ways: by course or by examination. An equivalent course taken at another university or college will be accepted as satisfying this requirement.

The CSUN courses which satisfy this requirement are:

Political Science 155 or 355 (formerly 305)
Chicano Studies 260 or 445
Pan African Studies 161 (formerly 272)

In addition to the possibility of completing courses offered by CSUN and equivalent courses elsewhere, candidates may also take an examination at other institutions on the principles of the United States Constitution to meet this statutory requirement for certification in California. The institutions listed below offer this examination. You will need to call the individual school for information and to make an appointment. The Credential Office does not have any information regarding these schools.
