

Entering Freshmen, Five Year Graduation Plan

An example plan for completing the major in Anthropology

For entering Freshmen, the following sequence of courses would complete the major within five years. This is only one example, however, and many alternatives and options (listed below) exist for most of these courses. A Freshman would need to be completing other University degree requirements, such as General Education (GE), from their first semester. To make smooth progress, finishing the “core requirements” at the beginning of the Fourth Year is necessary*. Anthropology 303 is a useful preparation for much Upper Division work and completing it as early as possible is advised.

Courses required in the major

Lower Division requirement: 6 units: 151 and 152.

Core requirement: 15 units: 303, 310, 319, 375/L, and 404.

Topical requirement: 3 units from: 311, 421, 423, 426, 427, 428, 429, or 453

Regional requirement: 3 units from: 306, 307, 339, 347, 351, 352, or 356

Seminar requirement: 3 units from: 490A, 490B, 490C, 490D, 516, 521, or 560

Upper Division electives: Five Upper Division Anthropology courses totaling 15 units.

These may be any courses not previously taken**.

*This plan follows the general pattern of offerings in the department. Students should keep in mind that a particular course may not be offered in the semester indicated here.

**One (and only one) Upper Division Anthropology GE course may count as one of these elective courses. The upper division GE courses are: 305, 308, and 315.
