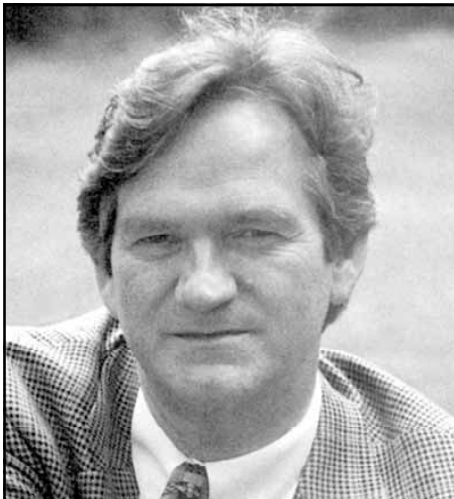


The Atlantic History Lecture

The Atlantic History Center began operations in the 2007–08 academic year. The Center is designed to globalize the curriculum in the History Department. Atlantic History frees the past from the confines of national histories and allows us to see the blending of peoples, goods, and ideas that connected Europe, Africa, and the Americas. New courses in Atlantic History have been offered at the undergraduate and graduate levels. For example, undergraduates can now take HIST 469W, “The Atlantic World.” Graduate students can now pursue an M.A. field on the Atlantic World. These advanced learners can take HIST 569, “Atlantic History Readings Seminar.”

Generous financial support from the History Department and the College of Social and Behavioral Sciences further enables the Center to hold special events. There will be an Atlantic History workshop on November 19, 2009, 2–4:00 pm, in the Whitsett Room located on the fourth floor of Sierra Hall on the campus of the California State University at Northridge. Award-winning historian and UCLA Distinguished Professor of Political Science and History, Dr. Anthony Pagden, will conduct a workshop on “How To Do Comparative History.” The workshop is intended for interested faculty and graduate students. Professor Pagden will talk about how he has written comparative history in the past. Questions will be taken throughout the workshop. This interactive, intimate workshop with an internationally recognized scholar will be a rare experience. Do not miss it.

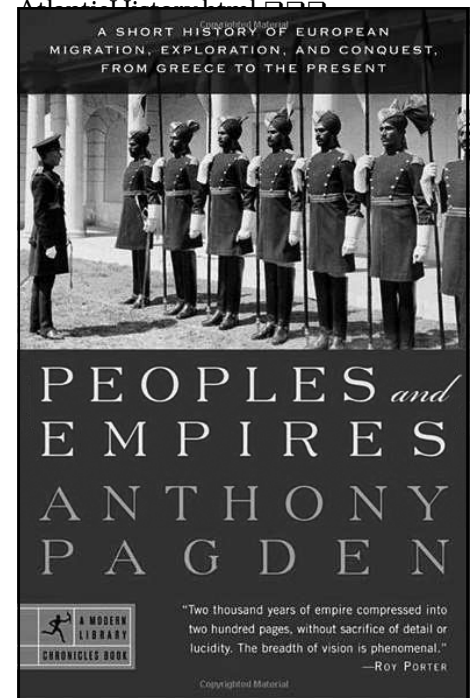
