

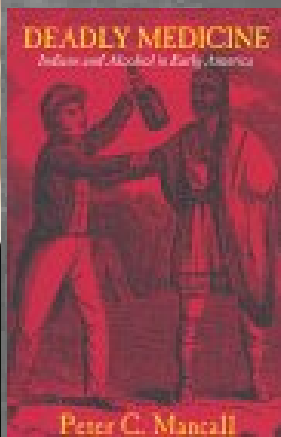

Award-winning historian and University of Southern California Professor, Dr. Peter C. Mancall, will discuss his cutting-edge research into the ways in which Native Americans helped connect colonial America to the wider world.

Peter C. Mancall is an historian of early America, the early modern Atlantic world, and early Native American Indian history (c. 1492-1840). He is the sole author of four books, and has edited three additional books. He serves on the editorial boards of the *Journal of American History* and *Reviews in American History*; and works regularly with teachers from the Los Angeles Unified School District through a Teaching American History program. He also directs the USC-Huntington Library Early Modern Studies Institute.
