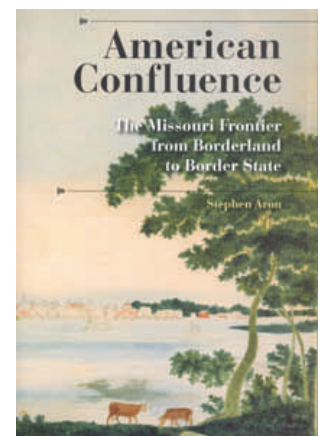
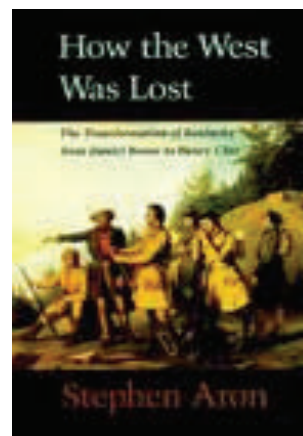
Professor Stephen Aron
