Here are some of the important ways in which the public's investment in the California State University system provides exceptional returns.

#### Affordable Costs:

While the cost of a college education is a concern for most students and their families, the California State University provides a high-quality education that is far less than the cost of the national public university average, as evidenced below.

### Access to All Students

The CSU is the nation's most diverse university system and the largest recipient of Pell awards in the country, with more than 118,000 students receiving grants. The CSU's percentage of undergraduate Pell Grant recipients is 34 percent, greater than the national average of 30 percent.

# Lower Loan Debt

CSU students' loan debt upon graduation is significantly less than the national average, with only 42 percent of CSU students carrying a debt of approximately \$14,000 at graduation while the national average stands at 62 percent with an average debt of \$23,000.
