HOW CAN I DECLARE A MAJOR OR CHANGE MY MAJOR?

Students must complete a "Change of Major Form". Forms are available in the ARC/EOP, Admission & Records, College departments, and Student Service Centers/EOP satellites. You may also go to www.csun.edu and click on 'students', then, scroll to 'student forms' and print the 'major or minor change or declaration' form.

Students changing their major or minor fields of study, and students changing from undeclared or undecided majors to decided majors, should be aware that they may be required to complete the major/ minor requirements in effect at the time of change. Undergraduates planning to add a double major must select both majors within a single Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree.

A request for a change of major or minor cannot be officially recognized without departmental approval, submission of the Application of Change of Undergraduate Major or Minor form to the office of Admissions and Records.

Some major's are **impacted** and limited to the number of students they can accept. These majors may have additional requirements before a student can declare.

CAN A STUDENT DROP A CLASS? HOW?

Students are responsible for attending all courses in which they are registered. Students are not automatically dropped from classes at CSUN.

Dropping a course is dependent upon the academic calendar, which can be viewed in the schedule of classes www.csun.edu/a&t/soc/. You can drop the course using the web portal on SOLAR. You must seek instructor's approval if you attempt to drop the course after the deadline.

CAN A STUDENT STILL ADD A CLASS? HOW?

The last day to add a class is the end of the third week of instruction. Students must obtain a permission number from the instructor and add the course through the registration system on SOLAR.

WHAT IF I WANT TO TAKE AN HONORS COURSE OR BECOME AN HONORS STUDENT?

Contact the department in which the course is taught and ask to speak to someone about adding the course. You need to obtain a permission number from the professor that will enable you to add the course via your student web portal account on SOLAR.

HOW DO I WITHDRAW FROM THE UNIVERSITY?

Visit the office of Admissions and Records, Bayramian Hall 1ST Floor and speak to your academic advisor. If you are 'undecided' go to BH 210 and set-up an appointment.

HOW CAN I FIND OUT HOW MY COURSEWORK TRANSFERS TO CSUN?

You can check articulation agreements between California State Universities and Community College's at www.assist.org. You can also speak to a transfer evaluator at Admissions and Records, 818.677.4689.

WHY IS THERE A HOLD ON MY REGISTRATION?

There can be a hold on your registration for any number of reasons. Check your web portal account on SOLAR for any holds you may have, or speak to an academic advisor.

WHEN CAN I REGISTER FOR CLASSES?

The registration cycle is dictated by the Academic Calendar for that academic year. You can view the academic calendar at: www.csun.edu/academic.affairs/calendar2005.htm. You will also receive a registration packet telling the time and date you can register.

WHO IS MY ADVISOR?

That depends on your major. If you are undecided/undeclared you may visit the Advising Resource Center/EOP at BH 210, or call (818) 677-2108.

DO I HAVE TO TAKE THE MATH PLACEMENT TEST?

It may be recommended dependent upon major, contact the Testing Center at 818.677.2369, in BH 225, or on the web at www.csun.edu/~tc2020/. You should also speak to your advisor for further information.

DO I HAVE TO TAKE THE CHEMISTRY PLACEMENT TEST?

Typically, only students entering majors that require Chemistry (CHEM) 101, contact the Testing Center at 818.677.2369, in BH 225, or on the web at www.csun.edu/~tc2020/. You should also speak to your academic advisor for further information.

HOW CAN I GET A COPY OF MY TRANSCRIPT?

You can get an unofficial copy of your transcript by logging onto your web portal account on SOLAR; click on "Services for Students" and then follow directions to download your records. You can obtain official transcripts at Admissions and Records, BH 1st Floor.

DO I HAVE TO SEE MY ADVISOR TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES, EVEN IF I KNOW WHAT I WANT TO TAKE?

Yes. You need to schedule an appointment to see your advisor prior to registration to

ensure that you are taking courses that will fulfill your requirements.

Can I just call the Academic Advisement Center/EOP and get my registration PIN over the phone, or stop by and pick it up?

No. You must contact Admissions and Records, located in BH 100, and request your pin number. You will need one form of valid ID.

After you apply, check on your admission status. You can check your status by contacting the Admissions and Records Office.

If you have been admitted, read all the material sent to you carefully. Determine if you are required to take the placement tests in English and/or Math. If you are required to take these placement tests, sign up for them as soon as possible.

WHAT ABOUT THE PLACEMENT TESTS IN ENGLISH AND MATHEMATICS?

If you are required to take any placement tests you must take them and receive your scores BEFORE you can register for classes. Take any required placement tests early so that you can register for classes on schedule.

IS NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION REQUIRED?

Orientation is highly recommended as a way to get familiar with campus, meet students and faculty, learn about resources, and take care of necessary business.

DO I HAVE TO PAY FOR ORIENTATION?

All students are charged a one-time \$50.00 fee for New Student Orientation their first semester at CSUN.

WHAT ABOUT HOUSING?

Housing for students is available on campus. However, on-campus housing is limited. The suites are air conditioned, carpeted, and fully furnished.

The Housing and Residence Life Office also assists students in their search for off-campus housing by providing updated listings of local apartment complexes. Bulletin boards are available for posting cards by students seeking roommates or accommodations.

HOW ABOUT FINANCIAL AID?

WHAT ARE THE GOALS OF THE GENERAL EDUCATION PROGRAM?

The General Education program is designed to introduce you to a breadth of knowledge that will prepare you to understand and participate actively in a diverse and complex world. The programs will help you develop lifelong skills and competencies such as critical thinking, written and oral communication, quantitative reasoning, and problem solving. The General Education program is divided into six categories.

CAN I TAKE GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES AT THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE?

Yes, California State University, Northridge students may complete lower division General Education requirements at a community college. A maximum of 70 units of transferable course work from the community college may be applied to a CSUN degree. In choosing equivalent courses, you must follow the CSUN plan and check that there is an articulation agreement for any course you take at the community college. The advisors in the Advising resource Center/EOP Center can assist you or you can log on to the state's articulation website at www.assist.org

ARE THERE BELLS?

No, there are not bells to signal the start or end of classes. It is the student's responsibility to be to class on time. Your instructor will let you know when class is over or if he/she has any specific policies to coming late or leaving early.

ARE THERE COUNSELORS?

Each student has an advisor or peer advisor mentor. It is recommended to meet with your advisor each semester to discuss your academic progress and what classes you should take for the upcoming semester. CSUN does have a counseling center on campus to help students with stress management, family concerns, relationship problems, etc.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU ARE LATE TO CLASS?

Each instructor will differ on this one. During the first day of class you will find out about your instructor's expectations for classroom behavior.

ARE THERE PROGRAMS OR CLASSES TO HELP MY TRANSITION FROM HIGH SCHOOL TO COLLEGE?

Yes! CSUN offers a variety of programs and classes to help students succeed in their transition to college - i.e. the Freshman Connection, a learning community. Orientation is the best way to get familiar with the campus and begin making the transition to CSUN. Students can also sign up for UNIV 100, a 3-credit class to assist students with succeeding in college. You can get more information about UNIV 100 from your advisor or peer advisor mentor.

WHERE IS ADMISSIONS AND RECORDS LOCATED?

The Admissions and Records office is located in the Bayramian Hall 100; you may contact them through phone at 818.677.3700 or visit them on the web at www.csun.edu/a&r.

HOW WILL I KNOW WHERE MY CLASSES ARE LOCATED?

The best way to find your way around campus is to come to Orientation and take a tour. Bring your class schedule with you and the Orientation Leaders will help you find your specific classes as well as show you the other buildings. A campus map <http://www.csun.edu/maps/cm1.html> is provided in your class schedule.

IS IT HARD TO GET INVOLVED?

No, it is very easy to get involved on campus. There are over 120 student organizations to pick from as well as a variety of events and Intramurals sports. During Orientation or the first couple weeks of school there will be lots of information on what you can get involved in and how to do that! You can also go to the CSUN (Student Government) Office to get information.

HOW CAN I MEET OTHER STUDENTS?

The best way to meet other students is by getting involved on campus. To find out more about getting involved, you can visit the Matador Involvement Center located in the University Student Union.

WHERE DO YOU BUY YOUR BOOKS?

The Matador Bookstore carries all books required for all CSUN classes. You can go to the store with your class schedule and people will help you find your books.

WHERE CAN YOU GO TO GET YOUR CLASS SCHEDULE IF YOU LOSE IT?

You can go to your student web portal account www.csun.edu/portal on SOLAR and access your schedule.

DO I REALLY HAVE TO GO TO CLASS?

College is different than high school; nobody will make you go to class. It is highly recommended to attend all classes so you do not get behind or miss material from the instructor. This is the number one recommendation from upper-class students!

HOW DO I GET AN E-MAIL ACCOUNT?

You are automatically given a CSUN account when you register through SOLAR. Go to your student web portal account at: www.csun.edu/portal. If you have additional questions or concerns contact the university helpdesk, telephone 818.677.1400.

WHERE DO I GET MY PARKING PERMIT?

CSUN Parking Services offers the option of purchasing parking permits on-line. University parking applicants can register for and purchase parking permits at <http://www.csun.edu/portal>. You will need your student ID and password to logon. The on-line service greatly speeds up the registration and payment process by not needing to stand in any lines at the Parking Services Office or during New Student Orientation. For a small service fee, students can register for and purchase their parking permits in a matter of minutes from the convenience of any computer, anytime.

Applicants should be prepared to complete all required fields, such as mailing information, driver's license, vehicle make, year and license plate number, permit type and credit card information.

WHO DO I TALK TO ABOUT FINANCIAL AID OR SCHOLARSHIPS?

The Financial Aid office, located in BH 130, can provide students with all the information regarding federal financial aid programs, grants, and scholarships.

HOW DO I KNOW WHAT CLASSES TO REGISTER FOR?

You are required to talk with your academic advisor your first semester at CSUN. Your advisor will give you information about what classes you should take. It is recommended to meet with your academic advisor each semester to check on your academic progress towards graduation.

HOW CAN I FIND A MAJOR AND CAREER THAT IS BEST FOR ME?

The Career Center [HTTP://WWW.CSUN.EDU/~HFCAR009/](http://www.csun.edu/~hfcAR009/) can help you determine a major and career that is best for you based on your skills and what you enjoy. They help all students regardless of what year in school. In fact, it is good to visit the Career Center early in your college career to research career markets and begin developing your resume.

ARE THERE COMPUTER LABS ON CAMPUS?

Yes, there are several computer labs on campus located conveniently near you. You can check for locations of general access computer labs at: www.csun.edu/itr/news/link/9909lrclabs.html

ARE THERE PLACES TO EAT ON CAMPUS?

Yes, there are a several eating options on campus. Students can frequent the Matador Bookstore, University Student Union, the Sierra Center, and Mercantile Exchange all located on campus.

IF I GET HURT OR SICK, WHERE DO I GO?

CSUN has a Student Health Center right on campus to provide medical assistance to students. You can make appointments to see a nurse or doctor, get health and wellness information, or fill prescriptions.

The Student Health Center is located east of the bookstore, or you can access them through the web at www.csun.edu/~shcenter/.

HOW MANY STUDENTS ARE IN THE CLASSES?

The numbers can vary depending on the class you are taking, but the average student/faculty ratio is about 24 to 1.

IS THERE A GYM ON CAMPUS?

Yes, the Fitness Centre, located in the University Student Union is available for all CSUN students at a discounted rate, telephone 818.677.3225.

WHERE DO I PAY MY TUITION?

You can pay your tuition in a couple ways. You can pay on-line with a credit card, or bring your payment to the Cash Services located at BH 100.

WHERE CAN I GO WHEN I HAVE GENERAL QUESTIONS?

The Information Desk on the first floor of Bayramian Hall can help answer general questions or direct students in the correct place.

CAN SOMEONE HELP ME IF I HAVE PROBLEMS IN MY CLASSES?

Yes, CSUN offers tutoring through the Learning Resource Center [HTTP://WWW.CSUN.EDU/LRC/](http://www.csun.edu/LRC/), located in BH 408.

HOW AND WHEN WILL I REGISTER FOR MY FALL CLASSES?

You will register for your fall classes during a freshman workshop with the help of peer advisors mentors, and academic advisors. During workshop, you will be introduced to CSUN's on-line SOLAR (Student On-Line Access to Records). The SOLAR system allows you to enroll in courses, place yourself onto wait lists for specific closed courses, confirm enrollment or course changes, and receive a complete schedule summary including class times, locations, and instructors. The full listing of courses and course descriptions are on-line via CSUN's SOLAR system at www.csun.edu/portal. You will need your new CSUN ID and pin number to access the SOLAR system.

HOW MANY CLASSES SHOULD I TAKE?

Full-time students enroll in four classes in the fall semester (an average of 12 units). Full-time students must maintain a minimum of 12 units. In addition, be aware of your financial aid requirements.

WHAT CLASSES AM I REQUIRED TO TAKE IN MY FIRST YEAR?

Students are required to complete all developmental course work within their first year of enrollment. Students are also required to complete Section A of your general education requirements.

CAN I TAKE A GROUP OF CLASSES TOGETHER WITH THE SAME STUDENTS?

Yes, CSUN offers a "**Freshman Connection**" program which lets you experience a small college environment in a large research university. You can take a cluster of interconnected classes together. The heart of the program is a linking seminar that helps you develop skills and abilities for success in college. Speak to your academic advisor for further information.

GRADING STANDARDS - FAQs

WHAT IS AN "I"?

DOES A "W" COUNT NEGATIVELY TOWARD MY GPA?

WHAT DOES A "WU" MEAN?

HOW FAR INTO THE SEMESTER CAN I STILL DROP A CLASS WITHOUT A "W"?

WHAT IS AN "I"?

An "I" is an authorized incomplete. This signifies that a portion of course work has not been completed before the end of the given semester. The student must work in

coordination with the instructor to reach an agreement as to how the remaining requirements will be met. An "I" must be made up during the semester immediately following the semester in which the "I" was assigned. If not completed, the "I" will be changed to an "F" in GPA calculation.

DOES A "W" COUNT NEGATIVELY TOWARD MY GPA?

No, it does not. However, a "W" does appear on your transcript. A "W" could have a negative effect on your Financial Aid.

WHAT DOES A "WU" MEAN?

The symbol "WU" indicates that an enrolled student did not withdraw from the course properly or failed to complete the course requirements. This happens when the assignments or course activities were insufficient to make a normal evaluation of academic performance possible. For purposes of GPA calculations, a "WU" is equivalent to an "F".

HOW FAR INTO THE SEMESTER CAN I STILL DROP A CLASS WITHOUT A "W"?

You should check the calendar printed in the Class Schedule. It has the cutoff date for withdrawing from a class without a grade of "W."

REPEAT COURSE POLICY - FAQs

HOW MANY CLASSES CAN I REPEAT FOR BETTER GRADES?

IF I RECEIVED A C-, D, F, OR WU IN A COURSE TAKEN AT CSUN, DO I HAVE TO REPEAT IT AT CSUN OR CAN I REPEAT IT AT ANOTHER COLLEGE?

MUST I REPEAT A CLASS THE VERY NEXT SEMESTER OR WITH THE SAME INSTRUCTOR TO REPLACE A GRADE?

I'VE REPEATED A CLASS FOR A BETTER GRADE TO IMPROVE MY GPA. IS THE CHANGE MADE AUTOMATICALLY?

HOW MANY CLASSES CAN I REPEAT FOR BETTER GRADES?

Under the repeat policy a student may repeat up to a maximum 15 units of C-, D's, F's, or WU's for better grades. Courses taken at other institutions are counted in the cumulative GPA. The grades for any courses repeated beyond 15 units will not replace previous C-, D's, F's, or WU's, they will only be averaged in calculating your GPA.

IF I RECEIVED A C-, D, F, OR WU IN A COURSE TAKEN AT CSUN, DO I HAVE TO REPEAT IT AT CSUN OR CAN I REPEAT IT AT ANOTHER COLLEGE?

Any course taken at CSUN must be re-taken at CSUN in order to replace the previous C-, D, F, or WU in your GPA. Any course repeated at another college will be averaged in when calculating your GPA.

Note: If you repeat a course the units are earned only once.

MUST I REPEAT A CLASS THE VERY NEXT SEMESTER OR WITH THE SAME INSTRUCTOR TO REPLACE A GRADE?

No, you do not have to take the class during the next semester or with the same instructor. However, the class must have the same course name and number.

I’VE REPEATED A CLASS FOR A BETTER GRADE TO IMPROVE MY GPA. IS THE CHANGE MADE AUTOMATICALLY?

Yes, Admissions and Records will automatically calculate the new grade into your GPA.

ACADEMIC PROBATION - FAQs

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE ON ACADEMIC PROBATION?

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE ON ACADEMIC PROBATION?

Undergraduates are placed on academic probation if in any semester their cumulative (overall) grade-point averages (GPA) OR their grade-point average (GPA) at Cal State Northridge falls below 2.0 (a “C” average).

CAN I BE DISQUALIFIED IF I AM ON ACADEMIC PROBATION?

Undergraduates on academic probation are subject to disqualification if their grade-point averages (GPA) reach the level of disqualification.

HOW DO I GET OFF ACADEMIC PROBATION?

Undergraduates will be removed from academic probation and restored to good standing upon achieving a 2.0 grade-point average in both their Cal State Northridge and cumulative grade-point averages.

CAN I REGISTER FOR CLASSES WHEN I’M ON ACADEMIC PROBATION?

Many academic departments place holds on the records of students on probation. You should determine if you have any holds on your registration by checking SOLAR online. A hold on your record will prevent you from accessing SOLAR Registration. You must

see an academic advisor in the appropriate department to release any advising holds before you can register.

WHAT

DOES MY GPA PLACE ME AT RISK OF BEING DISQUALIFIED?

Yes, at the end of Spring semester, if your GPA is lower than the chart's amount for your academic level, you will be disqualified.

Academic Level	Semester Units	GPA Disqualification levels
freshmen	(0-29 units)	1.50 freshmen
sophomore	(30-59 units)	1.70 sophomore
junior	(60-89 units)	1.85 junior
senior	(90 or more units)	1.95 senior

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE DISQUALIFIED?

A disqualified student is no longer allowed to register for courses at CSUN as an admitted student. All disqualified students should see an advisor in your majors Academic Advisement Center.

WHAT DO I DO IF I AM DISQUALIFIED?

A disqualified student who wishes to qualify for reinstatement or readmission must first see an advisor in your majors Academic Advisement Center.

CAN I TAKE CLASSES WHILE I AM DISQUALIFIED?

Students who were disqualified after the semester must take classes through Extended Learning or at another University. Readmission is not automatic; you must submit an application for readmission through Admissions and Records.
