### Qualifications:

A master's degree in field closely related to health administration is required. Evidence of effective teaching is also preferred. Work experience in the health care field is desirable. Applicants must demonstrate a commitment and ability to working with a racially, ethnically, and culturally diverse student population.

CSUN is a Learning Centered University. The successful candidate will be expected to join faculty and staff in a commitment to active learning, to the assessment of learning outcomes, and to multiple pathways that enable students to graduate.

At time of appointment, the successful candidate, if not a U.S. citizen, must have authorization from the Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services to work in the United States. Evidence of degree(s) required at time of hire.

### Responsibilities:

The successful candidate will teach in the health administration program at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. The successful candidate must possess the ability to teach a variety of courses. The following are examples of course topics and areas that we hope to have covered: healthcare finance, supervision of the internship course, managed care, marketing, strategic planning, human resource management, and other areas. The successful candidate will also participate in various committees, student advisement, review of curriculum, and other program functions. This is a non-tenure track position therefore a full research agenda is not required. However, the candidate is expected to participate within their profession and to maintain currency in the field of health administration.

Depending upon the candidate's particular skills and knowledge, the appointee may teach in other courses within the Department. The University especially seeks individuals who will contribute to both their chosen discipline and the University's significant commitments to teacher preparation and general education.

Applications must include a letter of application, current curriculum vitae, the names and contact information of at least three professional references.
