Qualifications:

Masters degree in nursing required. One or more years of patient care experience required. Also required: a valid and active California Registered Nurse License and clinical competence in one or more specialties as defined by the California BRN (i.e., medical-surgical, pediatrics, OB/Gyn, psych/mental health, geriatrics). Priority will be given to medical/surgical specialty. Priority will be given to teaching experience in upper division baccalaureate nursing education.

Applicants must demonstrate a commitment to working with a racially, ethnically, and culturally diverse student population. Evidence of effective teaching is preferred.

CSUN is a Learning Centered University. The successful candidate will be expected to join faculty and staff in a commitment to active learning, to the assessment of learning outcomes, and to multiple pathways that enable students to graduate.

At time of appointment, the successful candidate, if not a U.S. citizen, must have authorization from the Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services to work in the United States.

Evidence of degree(s) required at time of hire. The successful applicant will be eligible to be a recipient of the Kaiser Faculty Enhancement grant for professional development.

Responsibilities:

The successful candidate will teach in the clinical areas associated with their Bureau of Registered Nurses (BRN) approved area of concentration. Teaching and/or work experience in the area of medical/surgical is preferred. Other teaching assignments will be based on the individual's skills and knowledge. The successful candidate will be expected to keep current in their professional area, engage in student advisement, and program committee assignments. Research activities are not required. Appointments are generally for a one year period and are renewable up to three years after evaluation of teaching effectiveness and other department criteria.

Applications may be submitted immediately; screening will begin June 15, 2009 priority will be given to applications received by the deadline. The search will be continued until the position is filled. Applications must include a letter of application, curriculum vitae, evidence of teaching effectiveness and the names and contact information for at least three professional references.
