Qualifications: The Department of Psychology at California State University, Northridge invites applications for a position of Assistant Professor in Applied Behavior Analysis and Behavioral Clinical Psychology. Applicants must have a doctorate, at the time of appointment, and board certification as a Behavior Analyst (BCBA or BCBA-D). A Ph.D. is required for the granting of tenure. The department encourages applications from candidates who are trained in the areas of behavioral principles of learning applied to human populations, clinical psychology, or behavioral/developmental disorders. Applicants must be committed to working with a diverse student population. University teaching experience with evidence of commitment to teaching at both the graduate and undergraduate levels is desired. CSUN is a Learning Centered University. The successful candidate will be expected to join faculty and staff in a commitment to active learning, to the assessment of learning outcomes, and to multiple pathways that enable students to graduate. At time of appointment, the successful candidate, if not a U.S. citizen, must have authorization from the Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services to work in the United States. Evidence of degree(s) required at time of hire.

Responsibilities: The successful applicant will be expected to teach undergraduate coursework in the areas of applied behavior analysis and behavioral principles as applied to human populations. In addition, the successful applicant will be encouraged to support our two graduate options in Behavioral Clinical Psychology (leading to candidacy for Board Certification in Behavior Analysis) and Clinical Psychology. Curriculum development and teaching in either graduate program in their area of expertise is encouraged. The successful candidate is expected to develop an active research program, pursue extramural funding to support research activities, and be willing to participate actively in university and community service. The normal teaching load is 12 units per semester, although a reduced teaching load is available during the first two years of appointment and opportunities for reduced loads are available in subsequent years.

Application Deadline: Screening will begin December 9, 2011, and priority will be given to applications received by that date. However, the position will remain open until filled. Applicants should submit a letter of application, vitae, three letters of recommendation, and evidence of teaching expertise (e.g., teaching evaluations) and scholarship. **Submission of materials via e-mail to clinical@csun.edu is preferred but regular mail submissions will also be accepted.**
