# SCHOLARSHIP REGULATIONS:

## REPORTING SCHOLARSHIPS, AWARDS AND STIPENDS

### WHAT MUST BE REPORTED?

Federal regulations mandate that any and all resources made available to a student, to pay for the cost of education, must be coordinated with the student's financial aid package.

Examples of resources that must be reported to the CSUN Financial Aid and Scholarship Department include:

- SCHOLARSHIPS
- GRANTS
- FELLOWSHIPS
- STIPENDS
- BOOK ALLOWANCES
- FEE PAYMENTS
- DIRECT PAYMENTS TO STUDENTS
- WAIVER OF PAYMENTS

Federal regulations also stipulate that all funds received by a student; *whether based on talent, academic achievement, or need* must be coordinated with financial aid and be available for the student to pay for educational expenses such as fees, books, rent, food, clothes, educational expenses, transportation, and loan repayments.

### WHAT HAPPENS ONCE THE REPORT IS RECEIVED?

For students not receiving financial aid, the award is recorded into the student file in case they later apply for financial aid. If, however, the student has any unpaid balance to the university such as fees, on-campus housing rent, or unpaid short-term loans their award will be applied to these charges first. Any further remaining balance will be released to the student.

For students receiving financial aid, modifications may be made in certain instances. If the addition of the award will cause the student's resources to exceed the standardized Cost of Attendance, a financial aid counselor will first reduce any UNDISBURSED LOAN awards. Awards given early in the school year can usually be resolved in this manner. If this is not a feasible option a financial aid counselor may make other adjustments to the student budget such as accounting for child care expenses, excessive medical costs, long distance commuting costs, or even forwarding the scholarship to the next school year, etc. The Financial Aid and Scholarship Department will make every effort to avoid replacing grants or billing students for federal and state dollars spent.

### BECKY BERGER

#### THE WILLIAM RANDOLPH HEARST/CSU TRUSTEES' AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT RECIPIENT

On July 13th, 2004 the California State University Foundation presented fourteen students from various CSU campuses with the William Randolph Hearst/CSU Trustees' Award for Outstanding Achievement. This award is given each year to extraordinary students who have demonstrated superior academic performance, community involvement, financial need, and overcome tremendous life challenges. Each of the winners received a \$3,000 scholarship sponsored by the William Randolph Hearst Foundation, members of the CSU Board of Trustees, and other personal contributions.

Psychology major, Becky Berger, represented CSUN proudly as a recipient of the 2003-2004 William Randolph Hearst/CSU Trustees Award for Outstanding Achievement. Becky Berger is an exemplary student currently maintaining a 3.81 grade point average. Her academic success has gained her lifetime membership to many honor societies including the Phi Theta Kappa International Honor Society, the Golden Key International Honor Society, and the Tau Alpha Epsilon Honor Society where she served as the president for two years.

An icon of resilience, Ms. Berger has survived growing up in an abusive orphanage, homelessness, the loss of her first husband, and an abusive second marriage. After fully recovering from a stroke that left half of her body paralyzed for more than three years, Becky Berger continued to persevere.

Ms. Berger has emerged as a community leader and role model. She is committed to volunteering for many service organizations such as the Jewish Home for the Aging, Residents Against Graffiti, and Operation Sparkle, an organization dedicated to cleaning up San Fernando Valley communities.

We are truly honored to have Becky as a leader at Cal State Northridge, and congratulate her on receiving this award.

## COST OF ATTENDANCE

Due to the state budget crisis, State University Fees have increased for the 2004-2005 school year. As of this fall, CSU undergraduate students will pay a 14 percent increase in fees, along with credential students incurring a 20 percent increase, and post-baccalaureates and graduate students with the largest fee increase of 25 percent. Non-Resident students were also impacted by a tuition increase of 20 percent.

The fee increases make the annual undergraduate state resident fee \$2,334, the credential program student fee \$2,706, the graduate student fee \$2,820, and the average undergraduate out-of-state student tuition and fee \$10,170.

While the CSU fees continue to be among the lowest in the nation and less than the average fee when compared to higher education institutions in its cohort, this is the third increase to CSU students within the past three years.

In addition, all students pay campus fees that vary campus-by-campus and average \$526. Non-resident students pay the State University Fee, non-resident fee and campus fees.

As the CSU budget has decreased more than 21 percent over the last three years (a loss totaling more than half a billion dollars), State University Fees have risen over the same time span to compensate as damage control. These fee increases enable the CSU to steer away from further reduction in student enrollment and faculty or staff layoffs.

Because of the rising cost in educational expenses you must know how much the University Scholarship Program appreciates all the support our donors provide. Because of your generosity we can provide some relief to our outstanding students in times such as these.

As costs increase we need to ensure that our scholarship dollars do the same.

■ One-time gifts in any amount are deposited into the University General Scholarship Endowment fund. Scholarships are paid out at \$1,500 each.

■ One-time memorial gifts are also deposited into the University General Scholarship Fund. Families and donors receive an acknowledgement from the University Scholarship Program.

■ An annual contribution total of \$500 or more may be made on a yearly basis under an established donor-designated account. You may also work with scholarship administration to set the criteria of your recipients.

■ Donor-designated scholarship endowments can be established with a minimum initial contribution of \$5,000. Endowment donors may add to their accounts in amounts as little as \$100 or more. Scholarships are not awarded until the account reaches \$10,000.

■ Contributions can be made through Estate planning. Scholarship endowments can be initiated or added to by a Will.

■ All memorials and donations of \$1,000 or more are recognized on official publications and donor events.

Please Note: Endowment Spending Policy-Scholarship endowment fund allocations are calculated on the basis of the CSUN University Foundation's Endowment Spending Policy. At the present time, this dictates that four percent (4%) of the market value of the endowment may be allocated for scholarships, with the remaining income added to the principal to protect the purchasing power of the endowment.
