>> Shoe Drive at Calvert Elementary School

In 2005 more than 27,000 parentless children were forced to leave their homes in Africa and journey more than 1000 miles over two years with nothing, not even shoes on their feet. Which is why the Youth Services at Calvert Elementary School have decided to step up and help make a difference in the lives of children like these. The shoe drive will be held through Apr 30. >> AmeriCorps - Students in Service

The program *AmeriCorps- Students in Service* offers students the opportunity to choose one of three terms of service (essentially, the number of hours s/he agrees to complete) of volunteer hours, student teaching hours, unpaid internships for non-profit organizations, practicum hours or club/greek philanthropies. Upon successful completion of a term of service, students are eligible for an Education Award (scholarship), which can be applied towards outstanding student loans or the Cost of Attendance at a college or university.

The Education Award amount varies, depending on the term of service:

300 Hour Term of Service = \$ 1,000.00 Education Award (scholarship) One year

450 Hour Term of Service = \$ 1,250.00 Education Award (scholarship) One year

900 Hour Term of Service = \$ 2,362.50 Education Award (scholarship) Two years

Qualifications:

- Students must start by attending one (1) of the following orientation meetings in order to begin their enrollment in the AmeriCorps Program. The sessions will be held in the MIC on: Friday, Apr 24 at 10am, 12noon, 1:30pm and 3pm. Monday, April 27 at 1pm and 3pm.
