

## What is academic probation?

A student will be placed on academic probation if his/her **cumulative** *or* CSUN grade point average is below a 2.0 GPA. Student will be removed from academic probation once both overall and CSUN GPAs are 2.0 or higher.

*Note: Major GPA does not affect Probation Status*

## How do I get off probation?

- Repeat courses attempted at CSUN in which grades of D's or F's were earned.
- Obtain higher grades in new courses taken at CSUN to improve your GPA ("A"s and "B"s recommended).

## What is CSUN's Repeat Policy?

- A maximum of 15 units at CSUN may be repeated for grade replacement.
- Repeats for grade replacement are limited to grades of "C-" or lower.
- Only one repeat per course is permitted for grade replacement.
- Students attempting to enroll in the same course for a third time or subsequent time must be approved by the associate dean of the college of the course or face administrative withdrawal from the course by the end of third week.
- When a course is repeated for grade replacement, the subsequent enrollment must be on the same basis of grading as the first. The higher of the two grades is counted in the students grade point average, and the lower grade is replaced in the GPA computation. However both grades appear on the students permanent record (transcripts).
- Grades assigned as part of disciplinary procedures may not be replaced by repeating them.
- Students should be aware that other institutions admission committees – i.e. medical schools, law schools, or other graduate programs – might use the original grades in their own grade point computations.

## What is academic disqualification?

An undergraduate student on academic probation is subject to academic disqualification when:

A) **As a freshman** (fewer than 30 units ) the student falls below a grade point average of 1.50 in all units attempted or in all units attempted at the campus where enrolled.

B) **As a sophomore** (30 to 59 units) the student falls below a grade point average of 1.70 in all units attempted or in all units attempted at the campus where enrolled.

C) **As a Junior** (60-89) the student falls below a grade point average of 1.85 in all units attempted or in all units attempted at the campus where enrolled.

D) **As a senior** (90 or more units) the student falls below a grade point average of 1.95 in all units attempted or in all units attempted at the campus where enrolled.
