<u>Preliminary Single-Subject Credential Programs at</u> California State University, Northridge



What are my options for earning a Preliminary Credential in the SEP?

- Traditional Program (37 units): At your own pace, with two semesters of student teaching.
- ACT Program (37 units): Two semesters, fulltime, with two semesters of student teaching.
- *Intern Program* (44-49): Usually 3-4 semesters, for employed teachers.

All SED programs are post-baccalaureate, but SED 511 and SED 514 may be taken by undergraduates who are accepted with "Intent to Apply" status.

What subjects can I teach? The SED prepares for teaching credentials in

- Art
- Dance
- English
- History-Social Science
- Mathematics (Foundational Level and "full" Mathematics)
- Music
- Physical Education
- Science (Foundational Level, Biology, Chemistry, Geoscience, Physics)
- World Languages (ASL, French, German, Korean, Mandarin, and Spanish).

What are the requirements for the SED Preliminary Credential Program?

- Proof of competency in the credential subject, via
 - o CSET Exam; or
 - o State-approved undergraduate Subject Matter Program; or
 - o Undergraduate degree named with the subject area (e.g., BA in Mathematics); or
 - o Undergraduate coursework evaluation by participating "home" institution
- 45 hours of field experience working with groups of adolescents
- Fingerprint and TB clearance
- Passage of CPR training
- Undergraduate GPA of 2.5 (or 2.5 in your last 60 units)
