Spotlight on CSUN/NCOD Alumni: Daniel Girard

As the newest Vice President of the CSUN/NCOD Alumni Chapter, what made you join?

First of all, I had the best and very memorable time during my time at CSUN from 1996-2001. I developed wonderful relationships with NCOD staff, students, and the CSUN community when I was a student myself. The staff and students gave me countless leadership and personal growth opportunities that I am forever grateful for. When I left CSUN to pursue my goal to obtain my Masters in School Counseling and Guidance, I have always maintained my connection with CSUN. I visited CSUN and touched base with staff and students during my breaks. I always wanted to show my appreciation for what CSUN gave me. I asked myself how can I show my appreciation.—Joining the CSUN/NCOD Alumni Chapter as Vice President is my way of showing my gratitude –By

providing and supporting new students with leadership and personal growth opportunities so that they are able to reach their future goals.

What is in the future for our Alumni? Where do you envision the Alumni going?

Currently, we have many alumnus scattered across the country. Many of them have their own accomplishments and experiences in many different ways. CSUN/NCOD definitely contributed to alumnus' accomplishments and we want to hear all about it. I envision by having the Alumni Chapter, we will be able to reach out to different alumnus to join our chapter or form a sub-chapter in their area. The purpose of this is to maintain with networking amongst each other. Another goal is to get scholarships to help our current and future students with their current goal or after they graduate from CSUN. Additionally, I envision development of a list of resources for our current students and alumnus to take advantage of. All in all, NCOD/CSUN Alumni Chapter is the information and resource center for alumnus, students, and staff to refer to.

CSUN draws in many different people for different reasons. What was yours?

I hailed from Boston, Massachusetts and my roots were in the east coast the entire time. During my senior year, it was a challenging year making huge decision where my future would lead me. Luckily, my classmate had a friend who was a student at CSUN. My classmate and I decided to pay CSUN a visit during our spring break in April of 1996. I was in awe with southern California's weather, environment, and friendly people. That is when I decided that I was up for the challenge by moving to the west and attend CSUN. I wanted to do something for myself, develop my own experiences and memories, and broaden my own horizons. I was fortunate to have my parents support and they made frequent trips to the west.

Can you tell us one of your favorite memories of CSUN?

You are asking me to share ONE favorite memories of CSUN? That is definitely a challenge for me! Now, I am reflecting to my first year at CSUN and remembering the first experience that led me to become who I am today. It was when I became involved with the Lambda Sigma Pi (LSP) Fraternity. I had no prior knowledge of what fraternity was all about. Like I said earlier, I had planned on developing my own experience and memories, so from that point and on, LSP was the starting point for me to explore more leadership experiences and personal growth opportunities. I made memories by being involved in many different positions within the fraternity and had strong support from my brothers. I became President for LSP during 1999-2000. After getting my feet wet, I started to explore various opportunities with Deaf CSUNians and became the President during 2000-2001. At that time, I competed in Mr. Deaf CSUN Pageant in 2000, Alpha Omicron Pi's Mr. CSUN pageant 2000, Homecoming Royalty Court 2000, I was an Orientation Group Leader, and became the University Ambassador for CSUN. This involvement led to wonderful memories that will never be forgotten. To sum what I just said, my favorite memories happened during my involvement with LSP Fraternity and Deaf CSUNians organizations because that was what I loved to do.

Can you tell about your current job and what you do?

Ever since I left high school, it was my dream to become the school counselor working at a deaf residential school or university working with deaf students. My dream came true. I am a school counselor at the California School for the Deaf, Fremont. I work with students ranging from kindergarten to 12th grade. I do individual and group counseling. I also work with families to provide support for their children. My passion is to do school-wide prevention work. I am currently working with another staff from the counseling department with implementing a Character Counts program promoting

students to utilize "6 pillars of character" (Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Caring, and Citizenship) on a daily basis. For Character Counts, we do monthly activities discussing each pillar, create newsletters for parents/guardians, attend monthly department assemblies recognizing students who demonstrated positive character pillar during that month, and providing resources for teachers to use in class and cottage counselors to use in the cottage. I will be involved with team of staff for bullying training to reduce bullying for students on campus. I am also the facilitator for the Peer Advisor Program for high school students. Peer Advisor Program consists up to 8 peer advisors who provide support for students on campus, plan fun and informative workshops/events, and make CSDF a positive experience for students.

How has CSUN helped you with your current position?

At CSUN, I majored in Psychology and that is a huge factor that led me to my current employment. NCOD staff has their own approach of seeing something special about every individual and help them grow in their own way. NCOD staff was like a family to me and ensured that my experience here was positive. They made sure I was on the right track with my future goal. Whatever experiences I wanted to pursue at CSUN/NCOD, the staff and students were my greatest support. CSUN/NCOD helped me develop strong interpersonal skills, strong work ethics, develop my innovative skills, learn how to work with people with different background and skills, and realizing the importance of giving back to the school and community.

I am contacting you because *I need your help*.

We are looking for a racially and ethnically diverse group (African American, Hispanic/Latino/Chicano, Asian, Pacific Islander, etc.) of d/hh women survivors, ages 40 and older that would be willing to share their experiences with us in the DVD. Survivors also include those who may have been recently diagnosed with breast cancer and/or are currently undergoing treatment for the disease. I would also appreciate it if you could forward this email to anyone you think may be able to help us. Please pass this information on to your friends, family, and co-workers. The d/hh community is a severely underserved community among existing community breast cancer programs and research. I would be grateful for your help.
