CSUN's Oviatt Library**

What: The magic and allure of art in the sky — kites — are explored in the newest exhibition in the lobby of Cal State Northridge's Oviatt Library. The exhibition, Art in the Sky was first seen at the University last summer and explores the roles kites play across the world, including their history, the people who have used them as well as plans on how to make a kite. New to this year's exhibit is a continuous-loop video exploring different types of kites and how they are made as well as images of sport kite tricks and kite surfboarding. The exhibition also includes a new Chinese Dragon kite, made from silk, bamboo

and feathers, in a display case. The exhibition is free and open to the public during the library's summer hours. The library is closed Sundays. The Oviatt Library is located in the center of the campus. The exhibit runs through Aug. 13.
