#### Town Meeting on New Developments in San Fernando

The city of San Fernando will hold a meeting at 6:30 p.m. on Nov. 26 to discuss the proposed residential-over-retail projects slated for the downtown area on cityowned parking lots.

The meeting will be held in the Council Chambers of City Hall, 117 Macneil St., San Fernando.

The workshop will provide information as to how and why these developments are being proposed, what public benefits they will bring, the exact locations, what the proposed buildings could look like, what type of housing is

proposed and how public parking could be retained.

The proposed developments could provide 272 new residential condominiums and about 62,000 square feet of groundfloor space for retail shops and restaurants. There are a total of 934 parking spaces proposed including the replacement of 475 existing parking spaces.
