

Roleder leads USC women's volleyball team to victory

Freshman Kimmee Roleder registered a season-high 18 kills as the No. 4 USC women's volleyball team opened Pacific-10 Conference play with a 30-14, 30-21, 30-25 win over Arizona State at the Galen Center.

It was the Trojans' 23rd straight win against the Sun Devils, dating to the 1995 season.

Senior outside hitter Diane Copenhagen chipped in 14 kills while senior All-American Asia Kaczor had 10 kills and tied a personal best with four service aces while freshman Zoe Garrett had six kills and five blocks for the Trojans (11-0, 1-0).

ASU libero Sydney Donahue became the Pac-10 Conference's career leader in digs after recording 17 digs on the evening, eclipsing the record held by USC's Debora Seilhamer (2,071 digs from 2003-06). Donahue has 2,084 digs in her career.

Sarah Reaves led the Sun Devils (8-6, 0-1) with 10 kills.
