NORMAN HUGHES April 9, 1922 ~ July 20, 2008 Norman Hughes was born in a wood frame house on East Third Street in Perris to pioneer settlers Harry and Lupe Hughes. He was baptized at Saint James Catholic Church and in his youth attended Perris schools. Following the outbreak of World War II he graduated from Riverside City College and received an

appointment as an aviation cadet in the Army Air Corps, serving in the 94th Fighter Squadron in both Africa and Italy. He was released from the Air Force on combat points in 1945. In 1943, Norman married his college sweetheart, Phyllis Ann Nelligan, and after the war they returned to Perris where they raised their three daughters. He joined his father in a farming partnership that lasted 18 years. After his father's retirement in 1963 Norman accepted a position with the Riverside County Assessors Office. He remained there until his retirement as district supervisor in October, 1987. Norman gave many years to public service. He was on the City Council eight years, serving as mayor from 1956 to 1958. In 1960 he was elected to the Perris Elementary School Board serving eight years. He was part of the initial group of men who organized the Perris Little League and actively supported efforts to establish the Statler Youth Center (now the Senior Center). From 1973 to 1986 he was on the Planning Commission where he served as both chairman and vice chairman. Norman was a charter member of American Legion Post 595, the Perris Rotary Club, and a life member of the Historical Society. As a flight enthusiast he promoted the development of the Perris Valley Airport and was one of the first sky-diving pilots to work there. He and Phyllis enjoyed many years of flying with family and friends. He leaves behind his devoted wife and love of 65 years, Phyllis; their three daughters, Terry Beckley, Kathy Fennell and Robin Christie; sons-in-law, Mike Beckley and Dale Christie; and grandchildren, Shana Howell, and Cole and Wyatt Christie. he was preceded in death by his brother, Ralph Hughes and his dear friend and son-in-law, David Fennell. Norman's example of lifelong devotion to his family and friends, and country will be long

remembered. A man of integrity, he left his mark on everyone who knew him. His wit, humor, and legendary stories will be greatly missed. A celebration of Norman's life will be held at St. Vincent Ferrer Catholic Church in Sun City.
