COLLEGE BASKETBALL — Curtis Kelly, a 6-foot-9 forward, is transferring to Kansas State from Connecticut. He will sit out the coming season and have two seasons of eligibility remaining. Kelly appeared in 51 games in two seasons for the Huskies and averaged 2.4 points and 2.2 rebounds.

— UCLA athletics director Dan Guerrero has been selected chairman of the Division I men's basketball committee for 2009-10.

TENNIS — Top-seeded Mardy Fish lost his first match at the Hall of Fame Championships for the second straight year, falling to qualifier Rohan Bopanna 7-6 (6), 7-5 in Newport, R.I.

- Andreja Klepac upset top-seeded Agnes Szavay 6-2, 6-3 in the second round of the Gaz de France Budapest Grand Prix.
- Second-seeded Richard Gasquet stopped Czech qualifier Lukas Rosol 6-7 (7), 6-2, 6-2 to advance to the quarterfinals of the Mercedes Cup in Stuttgart, Germany.

FOOTBALL — Three roof drains in Lucas Oil Stadium sprang leaks when thunderstorms hit Indianapolis Tuesday night, leading to some water damage in a data center and other areas. But stadium officials say the damage shouldn't delay the Aug. 16 public opening for the new home of the Indianapolis Colts.

— New England Patriots running back Kevin Faulk pleaded no contest to misdemeanor marijuana charges in Lafayette, La., and received a year of probation.

HOCKEY — The Washington Capitals agreed to terms with Sergei Fedorov, 38, for a one-year, \$4 million contract and signed forward Brooks Laich to a three-year, \$6.1 million deal. Fedorov, the 1994 league MVP, was one of three trade-deadline acquisitions who helped the Caps end a five-year playoff drought last season.

 Columbus coach Ken Hitchcock signed a three-year contract extension with the Blue Jackets through the 2011-12 season.

OLYMPICS — Kara Lynn Joyce, 22, has been added as an alternate to the U.S. 400-meter freestyle relay after Dara Torres withdrew from the 100 free.

— French President Nicolas Sarkozy has decided to attend the opening of the Beijing Olympics after previously suggesting he might boycott the event.
