Cal State Northridge has ranked 11th in the nation in *Diverse Issues in Higher Education* for the number of bachelor's degrees awarded to minority students. The magazine, in its June 1 issue, said CSUN during 2004–2005 awarded 2,342 bachelor's degrees to minority students, 850 to men and 1,492 to women. Those students accounted for about 43 percent of the university's overall graduates.

A family counseling clinic in the Michael D. Eisner College of Education has been dedicated in honor of two faculty members and their son who created an endowment to support the facility. The Mitchell Family Counseling Clinic, which provides the college's family counseling services for the Los Angeles and Ventura county areas, was named for faculty members Rie and Rex Mitchell and their son Scott.

Eight members of the Matador men's volleyball team have been named academic all-conference selections this year in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation. This is the second consecutive year the CSUN team has won top academic honors in the conference, topping volleyball teams from other campuses such as UCLA, USC and Brigham Young.
