You are receiving this email because you are an incoming community college transfer student and you will be majoring in Kinesiology at CSUN beginning this coming fall, 2013. First of all I would like to welcome you to CSUN Kinesiology! I am Dr. Kim Henige, the Kinesiology Undergraduate Program Coordinator and an Assistant Professor in the department. Your first advising session for Kinesiology will be done with me. After that you will be assigned an advisor specific to your Kinesiology option (exercise science, applied fitness, general studies, dance, athletic training, or physical education). Advising will be done through workshops which begin in May. You should have already been contacted by Dr. Mario Lopez from the College of Health and Human Development (HHD) Student Services Center. Before you register for fall, you need to sign up and attend a workshop with Dr. Lopez and another with me. This year Dr. Lopez and I have linked our workshops so you only need to make one trip to CSUN. The linked workshops will take place:

The first hour will be led by Dr. Lopez, or one of his colleagues, and they will cover general advising issues, including general education. The second hour will be led by me, and I will cover advising specific to Kinesiology. I will also be available after the workshop to answer individual questions.

If you have not already done so, please contact Dr. Lopez's office to sign up for the workshop you would like to attend (818-677-2883, Sequoia Hall 111). If you have already signed up for a workshop, but you signed up for one that is not linked with Kinesiology (see days/times above), I recommend that you switch to one of the workshops above. Once the spring semester ends, those are the only days/times I will be available during the summer.

If you have urgent questions between now and the workshop, you can attend my regular spring semester advising hours on Mondays between 2 and 4 or Thursdays between 12 and 2 in Redwood Hall 250. However, I recommend that you also attend one of the workshops because the information there will be much more in depth. If your question is simple, you can send me an email, but I generally do not advise over email.
