The **Department Honors Program** recognizes and supports the academic and professional development of exceptional undergraduate students earning the *B.A. in Child and Adolescent Development*. Students in the Honors Program engage in advanced level assignments, activities and projects beyond the standard requirements for the degree. Students who successfully complete all requirements for the Program will have the designation of *Department Honors* noted on the diploma and official transcripts upon completion of the degree.

ELIGIBILTY

Students interested in joining the Department Honors Program must:

- 1) Be a declared Child and Adolescent Development (CADV) major
- 2) Have a planned graduation date of Spring 2015 or beyond
- 3) Have completed or be currently enrolled in CADV 380/L
- 4) Have earned a score of 9 or higher on the Upper Division Writing Proficiency Exam
- 5) Have a minimum 3.25 cumulative GPA (first-semester transfer students should report grades from their prior university/college)

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Students who meet the above stated eligibility criteria should apply to enter the program by the posted deadline (typically in November) no later than the fall of their junior year.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Students accepted into the Department Honors Program must complete ALL of the following requirements:

- 1) Complete CADV 381H and CADV 381LH lab with a grade of B+ or better*
- 2) Complete CADV 470H with a grade of B+ or better
- 3) Earn a passing grade in CADV 495A and CADV 495B
- 4) Successfully complete a Department Sponsored Internship (CADV 394 and CADV 494)
- 5) Successfully present an Honors Project at the Department Honors Forum**
- 6) Maintain a minimum cumulative 3.50 GPA in all upper-division coursework for the major

*Students completing a second major in Psychology may petition the CADV Department to substitute PSYCH 320H/LH and PSYCH 320H/LH in place of CADV 380H/LH and CADV 380H/LH requirement by completing a course substitution petition. Students double majoring in Psychology may also petition to use PSYCH 321H and PSYCH 321LH in place of CADV 381H and CADV 381LH.

**Honors Projects must be conducted under the supervision of a faculty member in Child and Adolescent Development. The project may be an empirical research project, a literature review project, or a community project.
