

Dr. Hull's research encompasses three complementary themes in anthropological archaeology: (1) the cultural impact of colonial encounters on native people of North America and the process of European colonialism within native communities more generally; (2) the interplay of demography and culture, with particular emphasis on small-scale, hunting and gathering societies; and (3) identity and ethnogenesis in pre-literate societies, including how people assert and defend their identity through material culture.
