Cal State Northridge has received a \$200,000, two-year grant from State Farm to develop an arts program that will bring thousands of San Fernando Valley K–12 students to the CSUN campus. The State Farm Educational Arts Experience will provide hundreds of K-12 teachers with training in arts education, and then invite them and their students to the campus so those teachers can put what they learned into practice.

Cal State Northridge's current energy use per square foot of building area is one third of 1970 levels. The university is currently one of the leading CSU campuses in energy efficiency.

Earlier this year, Cal State Northridge faculty and staff began formalizing a set of initiatives aimed at strengthening sustainable practices at CSUN. A sustainability task force was established and it is working to create a multi-college institute on campus to coordinate and organize CSUN's research, teaching and overall sustainability efforts.
