Rodrigue Mels hit a key three-pointer late in overtime and Cal State Northridge secured its first Big West Conference crown with a 71–66 win over Pacific.

Cal State Northridge’s Michael D. Eisner College of Education has received a grant from the Orfalea Foundations to help new teachers better understand the unique neurodevelopmental characteristics of all the learners in their classrooms. The Orfalea gift will support a pilot program to train K–12 teachers in neurodevelopmental methodology—the science of learning—and then assess how they use their training when actually working with children.

CSUN geography professor emeritus William Bowen has created an online atlas that allows people to see the Himalayas “in a way formerly unimagined.” The Himalayas Atlas of Aerial Panoramas contains more than 700 computer-generated panoramas that capture every square foot of the range between Arunachal Pradesh to the east and Uttar Pradesh to the west, encompassing Nepal, Sikkim, Bhutan, portions of Tibet and the Indian lowlands.

After winning 30 national titles and 53 conference championships at the NCAA Division II level, the university in 1990 moved athletics to NCAA Division I. Darcy Arreola became CSUN’s first Division I Champion, winning the women’s 1500m-track competition.
