Cal State Northridge's current carbon footprint has been certified at 15 percent below the university's 1990 baseline, putting the campus in compliance with the year 2020 goals established by California's Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006.

Cal State Northridge has the third largest population of deaf and hard-of-hearing students in the United States, and the largest in the country studying on a mainstream campus. The university's budget for signing services alone is \$1.2 million annually.

Cal State Northridge music professor emeritus Aurelio de la Vega was nominated for a Latin Grammy for Best Classical Contemporary Composition. The piece that caught the attention of his peers in the music industry was "Variación del Recuerdo (Variations of a Memory)," performed by the North/South Chamber Orchestra and included on the album, "Remembrances-Recuerdos," a compilation of music by composers from Cuba and the United States.

Monterey Hall opened in April of 1959 as a women's residence at what was then known as San Fernando Valley State College. All single, female students under the age of 21 and not living with their parents were required to live there. Monterey Hall today is home to CSUN's Department of Communication Disorders and Sciences and the department's community outreach programs, including the renowned Language, Speech and Hearing Center.
