### The Geopolitics of Political Science and Gender Studies in Latin America



**Dr. Breny Mendoza** is Associate Professor of Gender and Women's Studies at California State University, Northridge. She received her Ph.D. from Cornell University (1994) in City and Regional Planning. She has a Master's in Political Science from the Free University of Berlin and a B.A. from the University of Heidelberg, Germany. Her research focuses on feminist political theory, transnational feminisms, and Latinamericanism. Dr. Mendoza has three books: *The Making of the Honduran Feminist Movement*, *Rethinking the Political*, and a co-edited book with Debra Castillo and Mary Jo Dudley entitled *Rethinking Feminism in the Americas*. Dr. Mendoza also has ample experience in the field of gender and development as a consultant to international organizations such as the United Nations, the European Union, GTZ-German government and others. Her last consultancy in 2003 produced the conceptual paper and policy framework for the Honduran government entitled "Towards a New Approach of Gender Mainstreaming in the Poverty Reduction Strategy in Honduras" GTZ/UNAT, Tegucigalpa, Honduras. Currently she is conducting research on contemporary debates of empire and democracy from a feminist postoccidental perspective.
