## Call for Papers, Posters, and Maps

Annual Conference of the California Geographical Society

May 1-3 2009

Santa Ynez Valley, CA

The California Geographical Society invites geography faculty, students, and professionals to present papers, posters, and/or maps at our annual conference to be held in Santa Ynez Valley, California, from May 1-3, 2009 (presentations take place Saturday May 2nd only). We welcome presentations from across the broad range of geographical topics, regions, and themes.

### 1. ALL PRESENTERS

All presenters must register for the conference. See [www.calgeog.org](http://www.calgeog.org) for details. Deadline is April 4<sup>th</sup>, 2009.

### 2. PAPER PRESENTERS

All papers must be presented within a maximum 20-minute period, including time for questions. The CGS will provide a PC and digital projector for presentations. Please familiarize yourself with all hardware and software in your venue before presenting. You are strongly encouraged to bring backups and hard copies (transparencies) of all digital media. Screens and standard overhead projectors will be provided. If you have additional needs (e.g. slide projector), please inform the CGS in advance.

### 3. STUDENT PRESENTERS

Students presenting a paper, poster, or map in a student competition *must* carefully review the appropriate Student Competition flyer in the registration/promotional materials posted online at [www.calgeog.org](http://www.calgeog.org). Other presenters may also find this information useful.

Students may enter *only one* student award competition (paper, map, or poster) per conference. Please note that conference attendees are discouraged from delivering multiple map, paper, and/or poster presentations at the annual meeting. Two or more students are welcome to collaborate on submissions; however, only the lead author is eligible to receive a student award. Second authors are eligible to present one additional paper, map, or poster during the conference, if they are the lead authors of their second submissions, *and are eligible* to receive an award. Students may present research co-authored with faculty at the CGS conference; however, these presentations are not eligible for student awards.

4. **ALL PRESENTERS** must submit their presentation information using the online submission form posted at [www.calgeog.org](http://www.calgeog.org).
