Add ENGL 463A and ENGL 463B as courses to fulfill the Extended Study 1/poetry requirement which is currently fulfilled only by ENGL 363, a course the English Department does not regularly offer.

Currently, the department regularly offers ENGL 463A and 463B and less frequently offers ENGL 363. Adding these courses to the program and DPR will ensure that students are able to meet this extended study requirement.

7. Estimate of Impact of Resources within Department, for other Departments and the University:

Adding these courses to the list of options that fulfill the Extended Study 1 requirement will have minimal impact on the English Department or any other departments within the University, since these courses are already offered on a regular basis. The English Department does not predict the need to offer additional sections of ENGL 463A and 463B in order to accommodate this FYI requirement, especially because these courses have been regularly taken by FYI students to fulfill the poetry Extended Study for a number of years.

These assignments measure student abilities to understand and interpret the readings, synthesize the interpretations of multiple texts, and integrate these interpretations with appropriate cultural and literary theories. Additionally, the assignments measure student abilities to think critically: to assess their own methods of understanding and interpreting texts that have been created from cultural perspectives often times different from their own.

The Four-Year Integrated English Teacher Credential Program (FYI-English) for freshmen requires that students apply and be accepted to the program. Readiness for college-level work is one prerequisite. Students admitted to the FYI Program will be assigned to a cohort in their freshman year and they, with their cohort, will complete the coursework in the designated order outlined here. FYI-English integrates English subject matter coursework and the coursework included in professional preparation.
