Change current Spring Semester, Year 2 requirement that FYI Option in English students must take PSY 312 to fulfill their UD GE: SE/SS requirement. Several years ago, the Psychology Department requested that FYI students no longer take this course without completing lower-division prerequisites in PSY. We wish to change catalog and DPR language to reflect that FYI students may now take any UD GE: SE/SS course to fulfill this upper-division GE requirement.

6. Justification for Request: (Attach)

The current language and requirements in the catalog and DPR do not accurately reflect the English Department's practice of advising FYI Option in English students to take any UD GE: SE/SS to fulfill this upper-division GE requirement. As a result of this lack of correspondence between official documents and advisement practices, there are two problems:

- 1) students may be confused about this requirement and enroll in PSY 312 without having completed the prerequisites required by the Psychology Department, and
- 2) the FYI/JYI Adviser in the English Department has to file individualized course substitution forms for each FYI student to indicate that a course other than PSY 312 fulfills this requirement, creating extra paperwork and advisement monitoring.

7. Estimate of Impact of Resources within Department, for other Departments and the University: (Attach)

There should be minimal impact on university resources as a result of this shift from requiring one specific UD GE course for FYI students to requiring them to choose a course of this designation from among all of the CSUN courses that fulfill this UD GE requirement. The Psychology Department has indicated that it does not want FYI students who have not taken the appropriate prerequisites for PSY 312, suggesting that they are willing to lose FTEs in the interest of assuring all students in this course have required prerequisites. Moreover, the FYI Option in English major has a relatively small enrollment, fluctuating between approximately 15 to 40 students combined in all four years of the major. Thus the number of FYI students taking a UD GE: SE/SS in any given academic year would be between approximately 2 and 10 students.
