Book and Coverage: Stewart, 6th Edition. We will cover Chapters 7,8,9,11,12.

Grades: You are guaranteed at least the following grades for the corresponding percentages:

- $\geq 90\%$ -A
- $\geq 80\%$ -B
- $\geq 70\%$ -C,

when computed from the following:

- Exams: 60%
- Homework: 12%
- Final: 28%

These may or may not be adjusted in the future, depending on how things go. However if the above setup gives you the best grade, then you are free to stick with it.

+ **and -:** I do give these. Note that for instance a 90.00000 will always be an A, not an A-, while an 89.9999 could be anything from a B to an A. Also, I am fully aware of the difference between a C and a C-.

Homework: We'll do the homework on Webwork. Although it is only 12% of the grade, the homework score may factor into any borderline decisions I have to make on the final letter grade.

Exams: There will be around 5 in class hour long exams. Although I don't have plans for it, I could also include shorter quizzes here (always announced in advance though).

Calculators on exams: No calculators on exams unless I say so. Even if I allow them, TI-89's, 92's or higher (and their HP equivalents) will always be banned. The use of those on tests will be considered cheating. TI-83's, 85's, and 86's are okay.

Make up exams: I usually don't give them. Tell me in advance about any problems and maybe we can work something out. Advance means at least a week before, not the day before.

Last day to withdraw: The last day to withdraw is friday of the third week. After this I dont have the power to give W's or sign any drop forms, even if you have a very good reason. CSUN is very strict about this.
