**Qualifications:** J.D. from an ABA-accredited law school, passage of a state bar exam, admission to practice and continuous good standing required. Significant and substantial experience in the practice of law is required. In addition, previous experience in teaching law at the university level, an M.B.A. degree from an accredited college or university, law review membership, experience as a law clerk at the appellate level, a history of scholarly research and publication and business experience are highly desirable. Candidates must be professionally or academically qualified under AACSB standards, with the expectation that they will become, in addition to other requirements, academically qualified during their probationary period. Applicants must demonstrate a commitment to working with an ethnically and culturally diverse student population.

CSUN is a Learning Centered University. The successful candidate will be expected to join faculty and staff in a commitment to active learning, to the assessment of learning outcomes, and to multiple pathways that enable students to graduate. At time of appointment, the successful candidate, if not a U.S. citizen, must have authorization from the Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services to work in the United States.

**Responsibilities:** The Department of Business Law is one of the largest nationally, with more than a dozen full- and part-time faculty. It offers a Business Law option within the Bachelor of Business Administration major in which approximately 400 students are enrolled. The Department also serves more than 6,000 College of Business and Economics students and more than 35,000 CSUN students through its undergraduate and graduate courses. In addition to the core courses (Business Law I and II) the department offers courses in Commercial Transactions Law, Entertainment Business Law, Intellectual Property Law, International Law, Labor & Employment Law, Marketing Law, MBA Law in the Business Environment, Real Estate Law, and Wills, Trusts & Estates, among others. The department's curriculum and service requirements integrate theoretical knowledge and practical skills to solve real-life problems for individuals, organizations and institutions within our community. Classes are taught using the Socratic method with its goal of participatory learning and the development of reasoning skills.
