Qualifications: Candidates must possess a strong background in financial theory and exhibit potential for scholarly research and publication. Prior teaching experience is desirable. Ph.D. in Finance or related field is required at time of appointment (August 18, 2010). Applicants must demonstrate a commitment to working with an ethnically and culturally diverse student population.

CSUN is a Learning Centered University. The successful candidate will be expected to join faculty and staff in a commitment to active learning, to the assessment of learning outcomes, and to multiple pathways that enable students to graduate.

At the time of appointment, the successful applicant, if not a U.S citizen, must have written authorization from the Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services to work in the United States.

Evidence of degree(s) required at time of hire.

Responsibilities: Position involves teaching both MBA level and undergraduate courses in Finance (and related areas). Normal teaching load is 12 hours per week with two preparations. However, a 9-hour load is normally assigned to faculty who are actively engaged in research and publication to support their professional activities. Faculty are expected to perform curricular and administrative duties associated with an academic appointment.

In order to achieve promotion and tenure, faculty are required to have an earned doctorate, to engage in research that results in refereed journal publications, and to demonstrate an ongoing commitment to effective teaching and community service.
