### Librarian's Report:

The library was a bustling place this past summer. We had 800 kids and teens participating in the summer reading club. We had 355 patrons come to 14 of our free movie showings. We had over 1500 patrons attending 38 programs. Notwithstanding the programs, many patrons visited the library to use computers, check out DVDs and books, read the paper and magazines and just to beat the heat! There were times in the library when nearly every seat in the reading room was full. Some of the more unusual programs were: a volcano enthusiast, a magic show, live therapy dogs to read to, an astrologer, a representative from the Peace Corp, a live folk song group, a children's tea party and live reptiles! We want to thank the Friends of the Granada Hills Library for their support of all the film screenings, the refreshments for the tea and summer reading club parties and the subsidy for the volcano enthusiast. It was a grand summer and you helped make it so!

Also, we are very proud to announce a new Adult Librarian, Mike Packard, has joined our staff. He has worked in three other branches (Sylmar, Studio City and Chatsworth) during his twelve years with LAPL. He brings a passion for Adult Programming and extensive professional experience to our team. We are so very glad to have him. Please stop by the Reference desk to say "hello".

August 20th our new City Librarian, John Szabo, joined LAPL. He comes to us from Atlanta, Georgia, where he served as Director of the Atlanta-Fulton Public Library System for 5 years. # Come Celebrate with Us!

September 17, 2012 is U.S. Constitution Day. Two-hundred and twenty-five years ago, the U.S. Constitution was signed by thirty-nine brave men who changed the course of history. This document established the framework of our government and the rights and freedoms we enjoy today. Constitution Day became a national observance in 2004. We are celebrating this event at the Granada Hills Branch Library with several programs: Children's librarian, Heather Sells, will be hosting an hour long Program for Kids by sharing stories, showing a DVD and singing songs. For teens and adults, we will be showing three movies: "Swing Vote" starring Kevin Costner; "Twelve Angry Men" starring Henry Fonda; and "The Best Man" also starring Henry Fonda. 

# BOOK REVIEW BY SANDY J., FRIEND AND WEBMASTER

"Merchants of Doubt: How a Handful of Scientists Obscured the Truth on Issues from Tobacco Smoke to Global Warming" by Naomi Oreskes and Erik M. Conway

This book gives a chilling account how politics and policy were influenced, to the detriment our society and to our global existence, by just a few bad scientists. Having come through WWII, they were fearful of Communism and anything that resembled government control challenging capitalism. Their work was supported by industry (oil and big business) whose profits were threatened by the scientific findings on tobacco smoke causing cancer, acid rain destroying forests and buildings, and carbon emissions leading to global temperature increases and melting of polar ice caps. These few bad men campaigned to mislead the public and politicians publishing in non-scientific journals denying, without facts of their own, data accepted for nearly 40 years by the scientific community. The public does not read scientific journals and scientists are reluctant to put themselves into the national spotlight. Without a doubt now, tobacco can cause cancer and acid rain exists and is only partly diminished by catalytic converters and electrostatic precipitators. The repercussions of the delays in regulating carbon emissions nationwide and worldwide are yet to be seen.
