

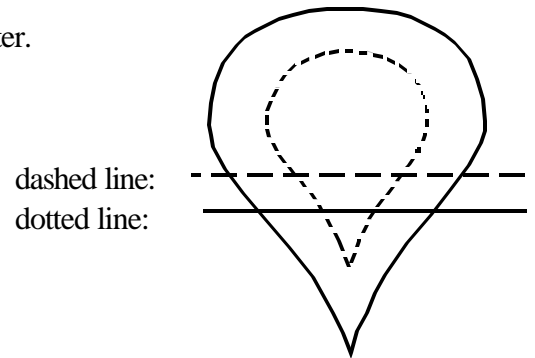
Tea Canister

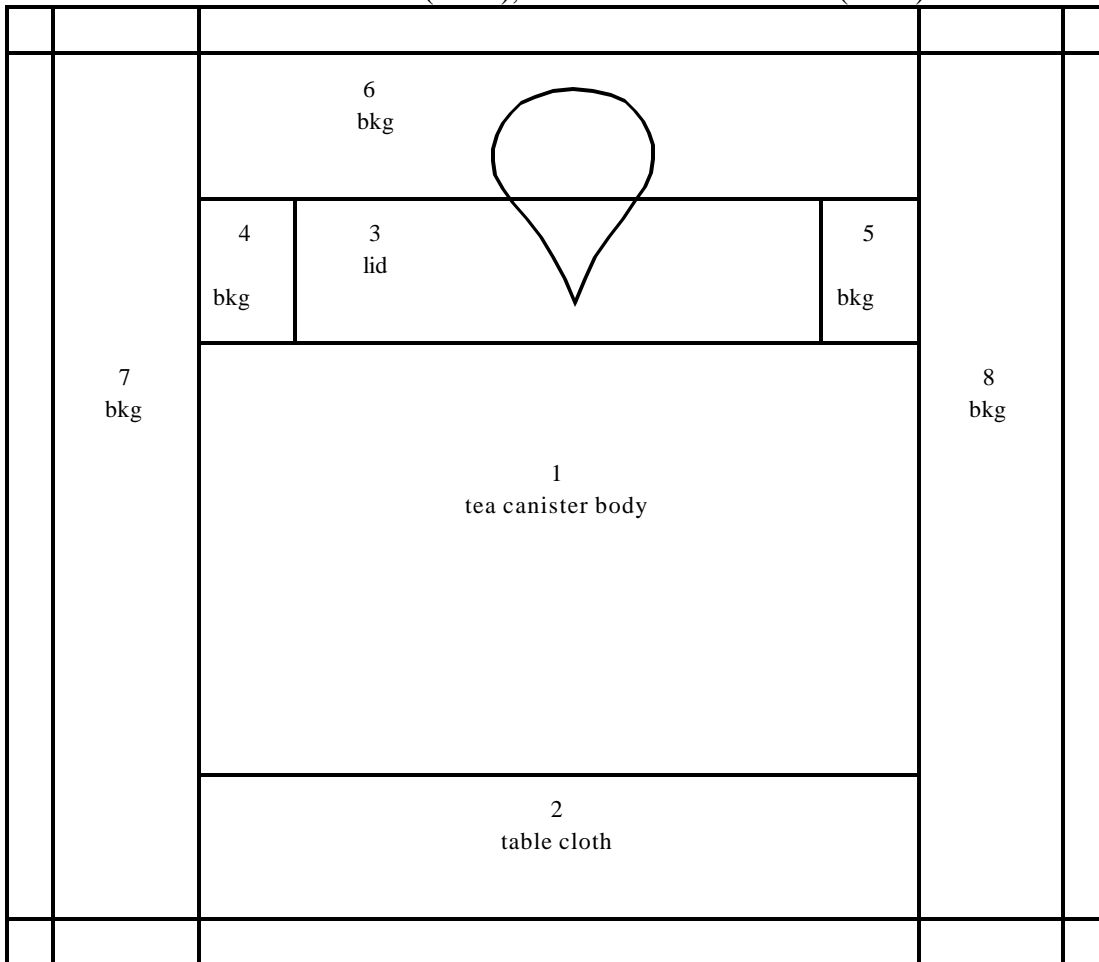
The pattern to the right is used to make a "handle" for the top of the canister.
Place upside down before stitching seam between (6) and (3-4-5)
When block is finished, fold handle up the and use an applique stitch to secure handle to block.

Try the following to make the handle:

1. Cut fabric for handle and a piece of muslin the same size.
2. Place right sides of fabric together.
3. Sew along dotted seam line to the dashed line; cut just below the dotted line.
4. Turn the handle inside out to form the handle; press.



Block is 5.75 x 5.0 (w x h); finished size is 5.25 x 4.5 (w x h)

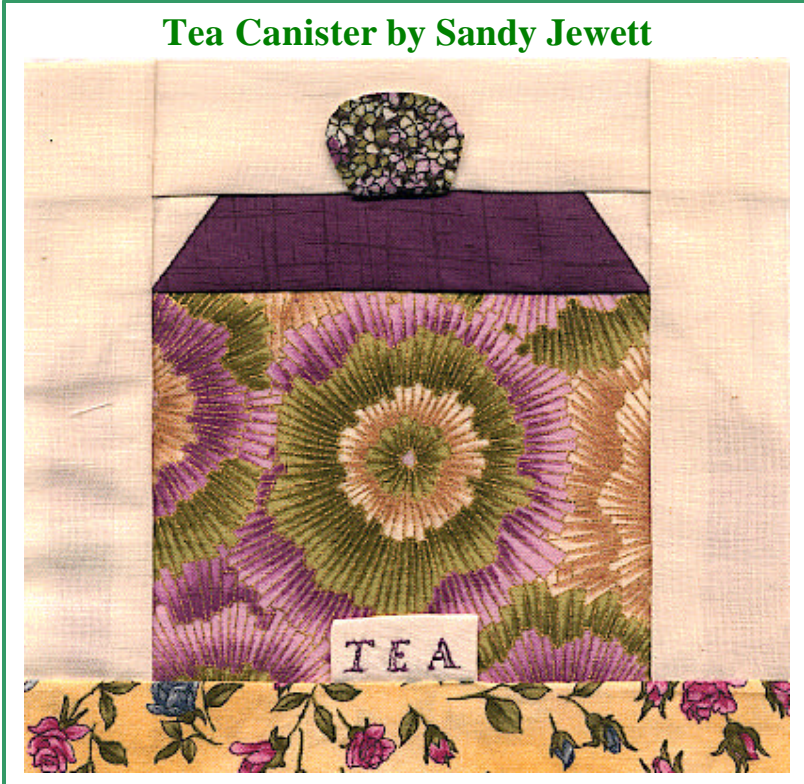


Note: This is a very simple design for which various dimensions can be changed easily.
