ELIGIBILITY: Must be one of the following: 1) a graduate or undergraduate student majoring in Family & Consumer Sciences/Home Economics or related program; 2) a student obtaining a Family & Consumer Sciences credential at an accredited college/university; 3) a high school senior entering a FCS/HEC 2yr or 4yr college or university program in the Fall. *Also* for:

- *Bay District Scholarship:* Must be a member of Bay District: AAFCS-CA (high school applicants are not members, but recipient must be a member and registered at time of award).
- *Marguerite Fenner Scholarship:* Must be a woman enrolled in Northern California college/university at time of scholarship award.
