SUPPORT SCHOOLS



New Pathway To Engineering & Biomedical Sciences Programs

Eligible high schools may apply for a grant in the amount of \$35,000 over three years to offset costs associated with implementing a PTE or BMS program.

PTE: \$10,000; \$15,000; and \$10,000 BMS: \$20,000; \$10,000; and \$5,000



New Gateway To Technology Programs

Eligible middle schools may apply for a grant in the amount of \$20,000 over two years to offset costs associated with implementing a GTT program.

GTT: \$10,000 and \$10,000

Existing PLTW Programs

Eligible high schools or middle schools may apply for a one-time grant of \$10,000 to assist with PLTW program enhancements.

SUPPORT STUDENTS & TEACHERS



Eligible students may apply for a scholarship to assist their pursuit of a STEM-related degree through the state or national PLTW Scholar Program or through a customized scholarship for PLTW students or alumni.

Teacher Scholarships

Eligible teachers will be provided a scholarship to offset the costs associated with the PLTW Teacher Professional Development Program. Funds may be dedicated to subsidize costs on a national, state, or local level, as well as in-service or pre-service teachers.
