MODIFY THE ENVIRONMENT

Create a homework space that works for your student

- Lighting, desk space, colors, materials they enjoy, bulletin board, comfortable chair, etc.
- Designate one space where they can work on homework and then clean up



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MODIFY THE ENVIRONMENT

Have all necessary materials available for your child

- Keep them near the homework space
- Task boxes with all necessary materials

Provide Organizational Tools

- Calendars, task lists, whiteboard, timers, file boxes, etc.
- Label supplies to help your student find things they need



MODIFY THE ENVIRONMENT

Limit Distractions

- Turn off television! Even if it is in another room it can be distracting
 Homework Cubby
- Provide noise canceling headphones or earplugs if there are other distractions such as multiple children
- Provide other children with quiet activities to do during homework time



TASK BOX

Keep all necessary materials in one spot

- Container to keep all items
- Label where things go
- Keep it in same place
- Kids can get it out and put it back
- Good if you are using a shared space such as the dining room



GIVING CHOICE

- Alternative locations may be a good way of providing choice,
 Do you want to do your homework in the dining room or at your desk?
 - Provide the needed materials to complete homework such as a clipboard or lap desk
- Choice of materials to be used
 - Color of pen, pencil, or crayon, paper, etc.
- What order assignments are done
 - Intersperse easy tasks with more difficult tasks
 - Consider starting with hardest task if this will help your child focus and then move to easier tasks
 - Consider starting off with an easier task if this will help your child ease into the homework session

ROUTINE

- Create an after school routine
- Determine routine that will work best for your child
- Write it down and post in homework area
- Put event in an order that will help them complete tasks and reduce challenging behavior
 - Start homework right after school if this helps your child
 - Have a snack of take a break first if needed and then transition to homework
 - Use first then contingency, "First homework then video games"




ROUTINE

- Review the after school/evening routine on the way home from school or when you first arrive home (set expectations)
 - When there are changes to the regular routine write them down
 - Write list of activities on a checklist to assist your student with completion
 - Have a snack of take a break first if needed and then transition to homework



ROUTINE

- Limit time spent on homework to periods of time that your student can be successful
 - If they can only sit for 10 minutes then break homework into 10 minute segments separated by a break
 - Set a timer to help you and your student keep track of tim



TASK REDUCTION

- Break tasks down into manageable parts
 - · Amount or length
- Provide breaks as needed
 - Only provide a break when your student is completing
- If a break is provided when homework is not being completed the request for a break may be task avoidant
- Use break cards for students to request breaks







VISUAL SUPPORTS

Task lists, white boards, checklists, visual schedules, etc. Sand Timers

TIME MANAGEMENT

- Create a system to assist your child with managing their time during the afternoon
- LEGOs or Duplos to demonstrate time
 - Blocks labeled with events during after school routine (homework, free fime, friends, snack, etc.)
 - Place additional block to demonstrate wasted time (i.e., arguing)







TIME MANAGEMENT

- Clothesline time line for after school routine
- Eye hooks, string, 3x5 index cards
- Fold index cards in half and label with activities
- Hang string using eye hooks and place folded cards with activities over string in order of routine
- Write schedule daily and place it on white, black or bulletin board
- Magnets may be labeled with activities and placed on magnetic board







REINFORCEMENT

- Provide frequent reinforcement during and after homework completion
- Reinforcement increases the likelihood that behavior will continue
- Behaviors that are reinforced are strengthened
- When student is displaying appropriate behaviors reinforcement should be provided

REINFORCEMENT Effective reinforcement Tell the child exactly what they did "I like the way you started your homework right when I asked you" - specific praise Immediate - provide feedback right when behavior is noticed Provide reinforcement that matches the size of the behavior • Homework completion = 15 minutes of video games I finished my homework
