Coordinated Programming

- **Gifted Education**
 - Teacher MUST be at the IEP meeting
 - Student should attend gifted classes- peer interaction
 - **Enrichment AND** acceleration
 - Challenge, humor and concepts
- **Integrated Programming**
 - "Enriched Remediation"
 - Teach information about the remedial process-
 - "Task Analyzed Acceleration"
 - Challenging remediation
 - "Strengths without Weaknesses"
