Holders of a valid Multiple Subject or Single Subject teaching credential are allowed to obtain a license to teach additional subject areas without completing a full professional preparation program

 - Gives credential holder an additional credential or additional subject area authorization
 - Authorizes teaching in a K-12 setting
 - Is No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Compliant

III. Supplementary Authorizations

- Gives credential holder an additional subject area authorization
- “Introductory” authorizes teaching course content up to 9th grade
- “Specific” authorizes teaching course content up to 12th grade
- Is NOT NCLB Compliant in core subject areas and you may have difficulty obtaining employment with this authorization

Types of Authorization

Notes:

- You can teach a non-core academic subject such as agriculture, business, computer concepts and applications, health science, home economics, industrial arts & physical education
- For employment opportunities to teach a core academic subject, contact your school district
- Core Academic Subject Areas: English (inclusive of drama/theatre), Reading/Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Foreign Languages, Civics/Government, Economics, Arts (inclusive of music, art, dance) History and Geography.

Specific Requirements Added Authorization

Holders of a valid Multiple Subject credential seeking a Single Subject credential:

1. verify specialty area subject-matter competence
 - Passage of California Subject Examinations for Teachers (CSET), **OR** -
 - A California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC) approved subject-matter program, **OR** equivalent program
2. complete three semester units of methodology coursework
 - The CSUN course: SED 525 (any except ESL)

Specific Requirements Added Authorization

Holders of a valid Single Subject credential seeking a Multiple Subject credential:

1. verify specialty area subject-matter competence by passing the CSET: Multiple Subject
2. complete three semester units of methodology coursework
Acceptable CSUN courses:
EED 575 (3 units)
EED 565S (2 units)
EED 565M (2 units)
3. complete course work in developing English language skills for beginning readers (EED 520 at CSUN) or pass the Reading Instruction Competence Assessment (RICA)

Specific Requirements Subject Matter Authorization

An applicant will qualify for a subject matter authorization upon the completion of one of the following:

1. 32 semester units of non-remedial collegiate coursework in the subject area requested. For introductory subject matter authorizations, a minimum of three semester units in each of the specific content categories is required except for Science which requires a minimum of six semester units in each of the specified content categories listed.

Specific Requirements Subject Matter Authorization

2. a collegiate major from a regionally accredited college or university in a subject directly related to the subject to be listed on the credential.

How to convert Quarter Units to Semester Units

Multiply the Quarter Units x .67

Example:

4 Qtr units = 2.68 semester units

3 Qtr units = 2 semester units

Specific Requirements Subject Matter Authorization

Acceptable coursework must be:

- a. completed with a grade of "C" or better
(credit, passing, or satisfactory is acceptable)
- b. applicable toward a bachelor's degree or a higher degree (non-remedial)
- c. taken at regionally accredited institution
- d. granted regular semester hour credit
- e. from the subject department of the subject matter authorization being sought

Specific Requirements Supplementary Authorization

An applicant will qualify for a supplementary authorization upon the completion of one of the following:

1. 20 semester units (or 10 upper-division) of non-remedial collegiate coursework in the subject area requested.
2. a collegiate major from a regionally accredited college or university in a subject directly related to the subject to be listed

Specific Requirements Supplementary Authorization

- 20 semester units are required if a combination of upper- and lower-division units are completed
- At least one course in each of the specified areas listed
- The balance of the 10 or 20 units may be in any course within the subject category
- A grade of "C" or higher is required
- Education and education methodology classes and courses outside the subject area requested will not be counted
- Non-remedial courses are those which are applicable to a bachelor's degree or a higher degree at a regionally accredited college or university
