Introduction

Aline Martha Beeson was born November 8, 1924 in Atlanta Georgia to Virgil Augustus Beeson and Aline Ford Beeson. The family moved to San Francisco in the late 1920s and then to Los Angeles after 1930. Aline graduated from San Marino Hall School for Girls. In 1942, she lived at 1133 S. Westmoreland Avenue according to her mother's voter registration.

Eugenia A. Reid (Aug 1, 1924-June 26, 2006)	Best Friend of Aline Martha. Was called Genie and is referred to as Eugenie, Genie or G. Genie and Aline would be life-long friends.
Judith Laurel Andrews (b 1940)	Eldest daughter of Marjorie & "Red". Referred to as Judy.
Carol Elizabeth Andrews (1942-1970)	Daughter of Marjorie & "Red". Sometimes called "Pinky"
Janet Hamilton (1923-2009)	Friend of Aline Martha; they graduated together from San Marino Hall.

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

The Battle of Los Angeles, also known as The Great Los Angeles Air Raid, is the name given by contemporary sources to the rumored enemy attack and subsequent anti-aircraft artillery barrage which took place from late 24 February to early 25 February 1942 over Los Angeles, California. Aline doesn't mention this at all.

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Went to U.S.O. Dance at Breakfast club⁹⁵ in Griffith Park. I met some people and then 'Al'. Just like Raleigh I don't know his last name. He asked to come and see me and like the dumb drip I am I practically refused. I hope I get to go to one of the dances there again. I told Al I'd try.

I was so dumb.

Saturday, March 14,1942

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Dance at Black-Foxe¹⁰⁸. I met four or five people. Only danced with two but good dancers; one wanted to come over nearly squashed me, other wanted to write to me. Next time some one I like (As Al) wants to come over I'm going to say yes!

Formal.

The Black-Foxe Military Institute was a private school (kindergarten through twelfth grade) on both sides of Wilcox Ave. in Hollywood, adjacent to the Wilshire Country Club to the west and south and the Los Angeles Tennis Club to the east.

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The A.W.V.S. thing came off but no soldiers came. After I sat around all morning (Sat I say!) making a cake, the A.W.V.S. members sat down and ate it. It was a darn fine cake. If Ray¹¹² knew I could cook like that hmm? Should I tell him?

A.W.V.S. dance in Westwood. The chief wasn't there but Lew¹¹³ was. He was the Chief's buddy and he was drunker than. He wanted me to go sit in a doodlebug¹¹⁴ with him. Ha. I should! Then he walked off. I think Genie's Johnnie is a lot of fun. I'd like to vamp him¹¹⁵. I should, huh?

He was a goon!

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Dance at the American Legion Hall. First of all this P.M., we went out to Dark Canyon¹²² with Magazines books and furniture for the Army. There are 200 of them out there now, more draftees coming in tomorrow. I met a darling soldier at the dance. His name was Junto Korky. He wasn't cute but nice. I hope I see him again. This afternoon, we picked up a couple of soldiers; this eve a pair of darling sailors, Vernon and Johnnie. (Note - soldiers were Sammy and Ted, the ones 'bev' fell for later. both of them cute. There were 7 of us in the car and the boys made 9. fun.)

And so it all began.

Saturday, April 11,1942

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Dance out at Camp. Genie didn't come. She went off & did mysterious things. I think it has to do with the Middleton. Later - She says she met him by accident and he took her to see Bob Crosby¹³¹ because he made her drop her pie that she was going to feed the soldiers. Then he drove her home. Should I believe her? I wonder?

Go on, humor her. She got her story a little mixed up, but--

Dance at Camp: such simple words and so much has happened. I've done it again, only this time it's different. I get the strange feelings when I'm near him. I'm a bit confused about his name but I call him Bobbie. He was a boxer before he was drafted. I can't put my feelings into writing. I met him about nine thirty and he kept saying that he wasn't having a good time. But he stuck around (and when George kept cutting in, I cut him) He wanted me to kiss him G'nite. I said no. See him tomorrow.

Beer and they got some soda and poured about ½ pint of whiskey into it. We went back to the 'rec' hall and sat around for a few hours (we got there about 4:30) then we sat around for a few hours later. He asked me to kiss him, again but I said no. He said maybe I'd never see him again and I said I'd be sorry. After I got home I was. By the way, his real name is Cliff something. He fought under the name Bobbie Brennan. Cute, eh? He's got a 41 Chevie convertible coupe to add to everything else. He said he'd call me. I hope so -- but



We went inside and danced a little bit, then got mother to sit in the car with us (x Freddie) We were still sitting there when the party broke up. He said he'd call tomorrow! He'd better. After all if I'm going to marry him someday (he said so 3 or 4 times) I have to know him better.




