In 2018, Fabulous Fruit expanded its operations in Georgia to include growing peaches for commercial canning companies. Land was prepared, irrigation systems installed and 3,000 "whips" (baby trees) were planted. It is expected that the trees will be ready for commercial production by 2021.
