

Jill Sherman resigns as president of Cedar Crest College

ALLENTOWN, Pa. (AP) — Cedar Crest College is hanging out the "help wanted" sign.

Seven months after taking the job as college president, Jill Sherman has resigned for what she calls personal reasons.

A statement on the college Web site calls her departure "regrettable."

Sherman is being replaced on an interim basis by former California State University-Northridge president Blenda Wilson.

Board of Trustees chairwoman Cynthia Blaschak says Cedar Crest will soon begin a national search for a replacement for Sherman.
