Qualifications:

Candidates must have a doctorate from an accredited institution and a thorough knowledge of the field of American Indian Studies. Experience in administration or the desire to work in a leadership position is desired, as the successful candidate may become Director for American Indian Studies.

At time of appointment, the successful candidate, if not a U.S. citizen, must have authorization from the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) to work in the United States.

Responsibilities:

Faculty success at CSUN is measured by three criteria: teaching effectiveness; contributions to one's field of study; and service to the University and Community. The standard teaching load is 12 units (4 courses per semester). However, the teaching load for the first two years is reduced by 3 units per semester to a 3/3 schedule. Competitive reassigned time is available for research and other service at the department, college or university level. The successful candidate will be expected to teach courses offered by the American Indian Studies Program, but teaching in other departments is possible, depending upon the candidate's interests.

The Director schedules classes, manages the Program's budget, and supervises tenure-track and part-time faculty members. The Director is a faculty advisor for the American Indian Student Association. The Director develops curriculum as needed and works closely with University administrators. The Director receives two course reassessments each semester (2/2 teaching responsibilities).

Application Deadline:

Screening of applications will begin **December 1, 2019**. Priority will be given to applicants who meet the screening deadline; however, the position will remain open until filled.

Applicants must submit a letter of application, curriculum vitae, and three current letters of recommendation to the address in the section below. In later phases of the search process, applicants may be requested to provide verification of terminal degrees, licenses and certificates.
