Qualifications:

The Department announces the opening of one tenure-track appointment for an individual possessing an earned doctorate (Ph.D., Au.D., or equivalent) from an accredited institution in audiology, hearing and speech science, or closely related field, to teach in the undergraduate and graduate programs in Audiology as well as Speech-Language Pathology. ABD's will be considered but must have completed the doctoral degree prior to August 19, 2020. The position is available at the rank of Assistant Professor.

The position requires possession of, or immediate eligibility to attain and hold, California licensure both in audiology and hearing aid dispensing, as well as the Certificate of Clinical Competence in audiology from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association. Other related professional licenses and certificates are desirable. Applicants must demonstrate a commitment and ability to teach, mentor and work with a diverse student and faculty environment.

Prior traditional face-to-face classroom and on-line teaching experience and prior use of platforms for instructional technology are highly desirable. Prior experience with teaching doctoral level students in the fields of Audiology and/or Speech-Language Pathology is highly desirable, as are abilities in a second language.

CSUN is a Learning Centered University. The successful candidate will be expected to join faculty and staff in a commitment to active learning, to the assessment of learning outcomes, and to multiple pathways that enable students to graduate.

At time of appointment, the successful candidate, if not a U.S. citizen, must have authorization from the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) to work in the United States.

Responsibilities:

While teaching is the primary mission of the institution, successful applicants will be expected to conduct scholarly work, publish, and provide other contributions to the professional field. Therefore, a successful candidate should provide evidence of recent research and/or recent publication. The position includes work in student advisement, faculty governance and university service, as well as participation in the development of new programs in and related to Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology.

A successful candidate should have an academic and clinical background that will qualify him or her to teach existing undergraduate audiology core courses as well as graduate courses for the Doctorate in Audiology (Au.D.), and to provide supervision for clinical services in audiology, including hearing aid dispensing at the CSUN Language, Speech and Hearing Center. Evidence of recent clinical and/or research experience with pediatric populations is especially desirable. A successful candidate will also be qualified to teach undergraduate and graduate courses that support the speech-language pathology program in areas such as auditory anatomy, audiometry, and pediatric audiology. A successful candidate will be expected to participate in curriculum and program development. The successful candidate will be asked to indicate which areas would constitute teaching strengths for existing and proposed programs. The successful candidate must be available to teach on weekdays, evenings, possibly on weekends and online.

Other appropriate duties may be assigned according to the department's needs for sustaining the program, as well as for program development.

The successful candidate will be held to the standards and requirements of the college and department in which he/she is housed for recommending tenure and promotion.

Application Deadline:

Screening of applications will begin **December 16, 2019**. Priority will be given to applicants who meet the screening deadline; however, the position will remain open until filled.
