ANTICIPATED NEEDS:

Note: All part-time faculty appointments are temporary and do not confer academic rank. Final determination of part-time teaching assignments is contingent upon student enrollment figures and funding. Working in the State of California is a condition of employment.

Expected hiring range is \$1.812 to \$2.162 per weighted teaching unit based on degrees and qualifications. For a typical three-unit lecture/discussion class, this would result in an expected hiring range of \$5,436 to \$6,486. Lab and studio classes usually carry more weighed teaching units and more contact hours.

MEDIA THEORY & CRITICISM	Ph.D is required. Ability and willingness to teach with a common course syllabus provided by the department. Evidence of ability to teach a diverse student population.
CTVA 100 Introduction to Mass Media	Ph.D. is required or terminal Masters Degree in film, television, or media. Evidence of ability to teach a diverse student population. College-level teaching experience is highly desirable for all courses and specializations.
CTVA 210 Television and Film Aesthetics	Ph.D. is required evidence of ability to teach a diverse student population is required. Ability to teach Film and Television aesthetics from a critical studies perspective. College-level teaching experience and publication in the field are highly desirable.

CTVA 215 Cult Cinema

Ph.D. Evidence of ability to teach a diverse student population. Ability to teach film analysis and appreciation of films that have attained cult status. College-level teaching experience and publication In the field are highly desirable.

CTVA 305 History of Television

Ph.D. or terminal degree in related field is required. Evidence of ability to teach a diverse student population. Ability to teach the history of American television inclusion its inception, the Golden Age, the Network Era and Post-Network era, and American television's historical, social and cultural significance. College-level teaching experience and publication in the field are Highly desirable.

CTVA 309 Film as Literature

Ph.D. is required. Evidence of ability to teach a diverse student population. Ability to teach analysis of film and television adaptations and their literary or post-literary sources, from perspective of adaptation theory.

CTVA 310 History of American Cinema

Ph.D. is required. Evidence of ability to teach a diverse student population. Ability to teach American film history from the silent era to contemporary times from a critical studies perspective of industry, aesthetics, genre and movements. College-level teaching experience and publications in the field are highly desirable.

CTVA 319 Criticism in Cinema & Television Arts

Ph.D. is required. Evidence of Ability to reach a diverse student population. College-level teaching experience and publication in the field are highly desirable.

CTVA 400 Media & society

Ph.D. is required or terminal degree in related field. Evidence of ability to teach a diverse student population. Ability to teach methods of media analysis, that determine how media messages are shaped, their influence and effects on audiences; cultural analysis, rhetorical analysis, profit maximization, etc.

CTVA 410 Advanced Theory

Ph.D. is required. Evidence of ability to teach a diverse student population. Ability to teach theories and critical approaches to film. Knowledge of the range of film theories, including auteur, feminist, psychoanalytic genre theory, structuralism, reception, theory, queer theory, and postmodernism. College-level teaching experience and publications in the field are highly desirable.

CTVA 412 Classic Filmmakers

Ph.D. is required. Evidence of ability to teach a diverse student population. Knowledge and ability to to teach the unique personal vision and creative accomplishments of internationally recognized classic filmmakers, from the perspective of technique, visual style, content and social implications. College-level teaching experience and publications in the field are highly desirable.

CTVA 413 Women Filmmakers

Ph.D. is required. Evidence of ability to teach a diverse student population. Knowledge and ability to teach the unique personal vision and creative accomplishments of internationally recognized American and foreign women directors, from variety of theoretical frameworks, including auteur theory, feminist film theory, etc. College-level teaching experience and publication in the field are Highly desirable.

CTVA 415 A-Z International Cinema

Ph.D. is required. Evidence of ability to teach a diverse student population. Ability to teach the range of international cinema from the earliest days to contemporary times. Knowledge of the history, culture and traditions of the major filmmaking sites of world cinema. College-level teaching experience and publications in the field are highly desirable.

CTVA 416 Documentary Tradition

Ph.D. is required. Evidence of ability to reach a diverse student population. Ability to teach the Diverse range of documentary cinema, form the Silent era through contemporary times, including Major documentary filmmakers, movements Including works made for and presented on Television.
